Clarendon Hills Community Caucus Nominating Committees Announce Candidates

At the upcoming Clarendon Hills Community Caucus Town Meeting to be held on Tuesday, November 27, nominating committees will announce their endorsements of candidates for election to the Village Board (including Village President and Village Clerk), Park Board and Library Board, for terms beginning in spring 2019. In addition, the slate for incoming Caucus Executive Committee members will be presented and voted upon.

The nominating committee selections for Caucus-endorsed candidates will be submitted to the general caucus at the Town Meeting which will be held on Tuesday, November 27, 7:30 pm, at Community Presbyterian Church in the basement meeting room (39 N. Prospect Avenue). The nominating committee chairs will present the following nominees for the respective board open spots: Village President (Len Austin), Village Clerk (Dawn Tandle), Village Trustee (Matt DeDobbelaere, Greg Jordan, Carol Jorissen); Park Board (Don Draudt, Mike Barcelos); and Library Board (Dennis Derfiny, Kearney Kilens, Janet Tucker). The slate for the incoming Caucus Executive Committee is as follows: Chair: Jeff Chadwell, Vice Chair: Kaki Schnieders, Treasurer: Ted Walker, Secretary: Tim French. Additional nominations may be made from the floor at the meeting and if needed, votes will be taken to determine the caucus endorsed candidates for the next village election to be held in April, 2019.

All Clarendon Hills residents are encouraged to attend and participate in the caucus process.

The Clarendon Hills Community Caucus is a non-profit group founded in 1944 that adheres to objectives, principles, and by-laws as determined by the residents. The objectives and aims of the Caucus are to ensure honest and efficient management of Clarendon Hills village affairs by providing a means for non-partisan selection of village office candidates whose honesty and integrity are known and whose ability to manage village affairs has been demonstrated by success in other activities. All residents who are eligible to vote are automatically members of the Caucus. All members can participate in the Caucus process by serving on nominating committees, submitting candidate names, and voting in the public, open meetings of the Caucus.
