

Used On The "Gospel Of The Kingdom" Radio Broadcast

Q. IS CONSECRATION AND SANCTIFICATION THE SAME?

A. No. Consecration is no more Sanctification than repentance is conversion. They are related in this manner: Consecration is the individuals part in this experience, just as repentance is the individual's part in seeking for Salvation, but, the work of Sanctification and cleansing must be and is accomplished by a power far beyond that of human ability. Only by the Power of the Blood of Jesus. For our authority on this we note the following scriptures.

Eze. 43:26, They shall consecrate themselves. But someone will say that is from the O. T. Note this then: Rom. 1:1, I beseech you therefore brethren, by the mercies of God that YE present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God.

Heb. 13:12, Wherefore Jesus also, that HE might Sanctify the people with his own blood, suffered without the gate.

Permit us to say also that in the majority of instances where people try to believe or teach Consecration as Sanctification it is because they are not willing to pay the price to obtain an exexperience of Sanctification.

"The March of World Empires"

An outlined study of the book of Daniel By Evang. Ralph A. Durham SERIES No. 1 INTRODUCTION

1. The importance of Bible

Prophecy, II Pet. 1:19-21.

"We have also a more sure word of prophecy; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day star arise in our hearts:

Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of

any private interpretation.

For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: But holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost."

When we examine the preceedin verses of this passage and then note that Peter said, We, in the prophecies, have even a more sure word than the Things heard spoken it should cause us to realize how important the prophecies of the Bible are. Many people have said that it is useless to study prophecy yet the Bible is composed largely of prophetic truths, (the major part now fulfilled) and others have said that we use too much time preaching on prophecy but we maintain that the message of prophetic fulfillment and the close of the Gospel dispensation is the greatest of all Evangelistic messages and it is a proven fact that by far the greater part of all real conversions today are under the efforts of premillenial evangelists.

When the world is filled with religious reform and dead ceremony in professed Christianity as it is today we say that you one and all will do well to take heed to the prophecies of God's Holy Bible. Peter also tells us that the prophecies are a light shining in a dark place. No one would dare deny the fact that the world today, is the darkest place so far as the future and natural things are concerned that the pages of history have recorded. Sorrow, chaos, broken hearts and the atrocities of war are reaching unheard of heights, and we say that were it not for the light of Bible prophecy shining through that awful darkness the world would be groping its saddened way toward "curtains" for all existing peoples. But thanks be unto the God of Daniel and all the Holy prophets we are not in darkness, but the light of prophecy surely guides us on to the dawn and the rising of the 'Day Star."

Prohecy did not come by the will of men; but was God-given and Holy Ghost inspired and is one of the greatest of all God's miracles and gifts to the human family. When we stand amazed and survey the precise exactness with which God has foretold the destiny of men and nations our faith and devotions to him mount until all earthly things seem as fleeting views compared to His

great wisdom and power.

2. The truth and authorship of

Daniel confirmed. How? Mat. 24:15-16.

There is a very prominent school of thought among the modernists and higher critics of religious Theology which displaces Daniel from among the Prophets and deny the authenticity of the Book of Daniel. Our answer to that theory is, and in no uncertain terms that one must needs be the expression of dumbness in the final stage to even voice such a theory in view of the many things recorded in secular history which so clearly verify the fulfillment of the God-given prophecies recorded in Daniel's words and as a paramount verification of the truth and authorship of the book we quote the words of Jesus: "When ye therefore shall see the abomination of desolation spoken of by Daniel the prophet, stand in the holy place, (whoso readeth let him understand:)" We maintain that the words of Jesus are the end of all controversy and with these words of endorsement we accept all the glorious prophetic truths of the book of Daniel.

3. The two outstanding char-

acteristics of Daniel.

Many are the virtues of the life of Daniel but we believe that to two characteristics can be largely attributed the reason God used him in such an important role in the revealing to him future plans concerning the Empires of the world; those two being Faith, and Humility; and we are well aware that the source of such faith and humility is obedience to his God. Those same two characteristics which were so profitable in the time of Daniel will stand us in good stead today when after

many centuries we are privileged to see the very closing stages of those things spoken then. O! that we may have a like faith and life of humility as we stand awaiting the hour of Redemption and the rising of the "Sun of Righteousness" to heal a world torn and bleeding because of sin and Satan's hoardes of darkness.

4. Daniel was the pre-eminent prophet of the "Times of the Gen-

tiles."

In this manner; Foretelling the coming political powers or Universal Empires and the ever increasing rise of the forces of Satan and deception in those Empires.

Daniel saw very little if anything of the plan of salvation or Church age, except, the detoriation or apostasy at the end time.

Now we are ready to leave these introductory thoughts and take up a very careful study of the first chapter: Let us remember that it is by a prayerful attitude and a hungry heart for the things of God that our understanding becomes fruitful, so may we remain prayerful as we consider this subject.

Chapter 1

The first chapter of Daniel is largely history of the conquest of Judah by Nebuchadnezzar, and of the carrying away captive of the people into Babylon; However, there are some things which are important in this passage which we call attention to:

WHY WAS ISRAEL CARRIED CAPTIVE INTO BABYLON?

In Lev. 26:33-34 we find that because Israel did not permit their land to keep its Sabbath as God had commanded them they would be carried captive among the heathen so that the land would enjoy her Sabbaths. May we say in passing that the same spirit of selfishness and greed is sometimes manifested today, but remember, even though you may refuse to pay that which belongeth to God; somewhere down the way it is going to be collected just as it was from Israel by their going into captivity, and when it is collected it perhaps will be with compound interest.

In II Chron. 36:15-21 we find a very complete record of the reason Israel went down into bondage. After God had sent His servants the prophets unto them warning them of the dangers of disobedience to his laws they yet chose to go on in their own evil way, and to fulfill the words of the prophet Jeremiah they were taken captive into Babylon for seventy years until the land enjoyed her Sabbaths.

It can also be said that Idolatry was one reason why the captivity came and what a severe lesson did Israel learn in regard to their worshiping other gods which were no gods. Their going into Babylon took them to the very center and origination of all idolatry where they were well cured of their tendency to worship idols. Since their return from Babylon they have never been an idolatrous people as they were before. WHY DID DANIEL AND HIS

COMPANIONS RISE TO THE PLACE OF AUTHORITY WHICH THEY HELD IN BABYLON?

In this first chapter we find Daniel and his companions making a very noble stand for God, for which the Lord undoubtedly richly rewarded them and even back of this was a prophecy which must needs be fulfilled, and was in their lives.

Isa. 39:7, gives us these words, "And of they sons that shall issue from thee, which thou shalt beget, shall they take away; and they shall be eunuchs in the palace of the king of Babylon. Thus we se how exactly God not only knows the future and foretells it but how also he sees that it is fulfilled as he has spoken.

Thus in this lesson or chapter we have discovered the real reason for Israel's going into captivity and also how God dealt with Daniel and his companions from the very beginning of their sojourn there to fulfill, yea and not only that but to reveal great things concerning the future Empires.

Chapter II

As we enter into the study of the second chapter we are aware that it is far too great and extensive in nature to complete in this particular writing but the time spent on it will prove profitable.

Before we enter into the text itself we wish to note the Theme of the whole chapter and express it thus: "The times of the Gentiles." The things contained in this chapter are of vital import to us as we are living in the close of the "Times of the Gentires." Nowhere else in the Bible can there be found a more perfect chart of the course of Gentile World Empires than that revealed to King Nebuchadnezzar by the great servant of God in this chapter.

Before we read from the chapter in Daniel we desire to better acquaint ourselves with son'e of the things spoken concerning that

great Gentile king, Nebuchadnezzar. In Jer. 27:5-9 we find these words. "I have made the earth, the man and the beasts that are upon the ground, by my great power and by my outstretched arm, and have given it unto whom it seemeth meet unto me. And now have I given all these lands into the hand of Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon, my servant; and the beasts of the field have I given him also to serve him. And all nations shall serve him, and his son, and his son's son, until the very time of his land come: And then many nations and great kings shall serve themselves of him. And it shall come to pass, that the nation and kingdom which will not serve the same Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon, and that will not put their neck under the yoke of the king of Bebylon, that nation will I punish, saith the Lord, with the sword, and with the famine, and the pestilence, until I have consumed them by his hand. Therefore hearken not to ye to your prophets, nor to your diviners, nor to your dreamers, nor to you enchanters, nor to your sorcerers, which speak unto you, saying, ye shall not serve the king of Babylon.

Thus we have the prophecy concerning Nebuchadnezzar and in the text we find the fulfillment of that prophecy; Therefore we have with the coming a Gentile Monarch into world dominion the beginning of the "Times of

the Gentiles.'

WHAT IS THE CORRECT AP-PLICATION OF THE TERM, "THE TIMES OF THE GEN-TILES"?

The term is not found in the book of Daniel but is the words of Jesus, Lk. 21:24.

The idea held by many that it began with the destruction of Jerusalem by Titus is incorrect. and the common thought that it began with the opportunity of salvation being given to the Gentiles following the rejection of Jesus and his gospel by the Jews is also not the proper application of the thought. Rather the times of the Gentiles is that period of time which began about 606 B. C. when world power passed completely into the hands of a Gentile king, Nebuchadnezzar; (from which time Israel ceased to be a world power) and as history conforms the vision has, and will continue to be in the hands of Gentile Rulers until the "Fullness of the Gntiles be come in." Rom. 11:25. WHAT THEN IS THE "FULL-

NESS OF THE GENTILES"? There is a difference between the "Times of the Gentiles" and the "Fullness of the Gentiles." Namely: in that the former has to do with the political or Governmental powers of the world while the latter has pertainance to the spiritual or working out of the plan of salvation and will be reached at the time of Redemption of the "Man-child" and the flight of the Church, (Woman) Rev. 12: This is the "Fullness" of the plan of salvation, for out of the Gentile nations will have been taken a spiritual Israel to receive the fullest reward of the plan of salvation.

With this matter thus explained and we feel substantiated by the scriptures, we are ready to begin the study of "The Great Metallic Image" and the place it was to hold in the March of world Empires which will of necessity come in a later lesson. May God bless His word to the hearts of all peo-

ple everywhere.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS (Continued)

AMERICA WILL WIN THIS WAR?

A. I feel that I can unhesitatingly answer yes. America and her allies will win the war, with a scriptural background for answer. It is a vast field and would take us over many prophetic scriptures were we to go into detail, which time will not permit now. At a later broadcast we will deal specifically with that subject. D. V. but only briefly now we will say that, in spite of all their sins which are many. vet Great Britain and America are foremost among the nations in Honoring God, Circulating the Bible, Missionary activity and in refuge afforded the Jewish peonle.

This should sufficiently answer the question but let us turn to the Bible for a brief array of scripture. RIGHTEOUSNESS EXALTETH A NATION: Also, Isa. 60:8-9 gives us a prophetic answer.

"Who are these that fly as a cloud, and as the doves to their windows?

Surely the isles shall wait for me, and the ships of Tarshish first, to bring thy son from far, their silver and their gold with them unto the name of the Lord thy God and to the Holy One of Israel, because he hath glorified thee.

And the sons of strangers shall build up thy ways, and their kings shall minister unto thee: for in my wrath I smote thee, but in my favor have I had mercy on thee."

We know Isaiah did not see aeroplanes in his day yet this is very definitely a prophecy of the aeroplane and Isaiah saw it as men flying, so then that gives the clue that in this 20th century of the air filled with men would also come the restoration of Israel, by whom? The ships of Tarshish first, note that the isles and the ships of Tarshish are connected and also the term first, who was first to help the returning Jews back to their home land? Great Britain and America; Also the Lord said the isles would wait for him. What nations have waited upon God? Few nations have had any time for God in their programs. Has Russia waited for the Lord? NO. Has Germany? Has Spain? Has Japan? Britain and America are most certainly known as the world's most Christian Democracies. These nations maintain the open Bible and it is their most cherished book. These and other scriptural reasons undoubtedly tell us who will be most favored by the hand of God in this war.

Q. ARE THERE SCRIPTURES WHICH PROVE THERE IS A TRINITY IN THE GODHEAD?

A. Without one moment of hesitation, we say, YES, the entire Bible, from Genesis to Revelations teaches nothing else but a trinity; And the teaching of oneness is an erronious doctrine used by the Devil to so confuse the minds of many people until they cannot understand many of the great truths of the Bible, and also opens the door for the entrance of false spirits resulting in fanaticism and in-consistency. We give these few

references in brief though there are many others; At Jesus baptism, Mk. 1:11, And there came a voice from heaven, saying, "Thou art my beloved son in whom I am well pleased."

Then, Jn. 16:5, But now I go my way to him that sent me, Jn. 14:16, And I will pray the Father, and he will give you another comforter, that HE may abide with you forever. Jn. 16:8, And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment. As a final word in regard to this question I am going to say that the Bible is so plain on this truth that I doubt if many of the teachers who set forth this false doctrine of Oneness believe it themselves.

Q. ARE THE DEAD NOW IN HEAVEN OR HELL AS THE CASE MAY BE, CONCERNING THE WAY THEY HAVE LIVED?

A. The answer is, NO, the wicked dead are not in hell, the Righteous dead are not in heaven. But some one will say, O that spoils my thoughts concerning my dear, sainted mother who I want to think about as being in heaven and knowing what I'm doing, or that sweet little babe who is a tender blossom in heaven. In all respect to feelings, I say that when our traditional beliefs don't teach us according to the Bible we better give them up and find out what the Bible teaches and we will have a much better chance of entering into Life Eternal and enjoying the glories of heaven.

First, let us take David for an example. Surely, in view of the place he is to hold in the kingdom

of Christ, he would be in heaven if any one would be. In Acts 2:29 we find these words. "Men and brethren let me freely speak unto you of the patriarch David, that he is both dead and buried, and his sepulchre is with us unto this day. Then in verse 34, For David is not ascended into the heavens."

THEN WHERE ARE THEY? HID IN THE GRAVE 'TILL A SET TIME.

Job 14:13, O that thou wouldst hide me in the grave, - - - that thou wouldst appoint me a set time and remember me. (resurrection). Verse 14, All the days of my appointed time will I wait, 'till my change come. (resurrection). Verse 14, Thou wilt call and I will answer thee.

NO REMEMBRANCE IN THE GRAVE: Psa. 6:5, For in death there is no remembrance of thee.

NO KNOWLEDGE OF OUR PEOPLE IN THE GRAVE: Job. 14:21, His sons came to honour and he knoweth it not, they are brought low and he perceiveth it not.

THOUGHTS PERISH WITH DEATH: Psa. 146:4, His breath goeth forth, he returneth to his earth, in that very day has thoughts perish.

THE DEAD KNOW NOTH-ING: Ec. 9:5, For the living know that they shall die, but the dead

know not anything.

JUDGMENT, AND GO INTO FINAL AND COMPLETE DESTRUCTION IN LAKE OF FIRE.

Q. CAN A CHRISTIAN ENGAGE IN WORLDIY PLEASURES?

A. There might be many things come under the term worldly pleasures, and because of that it will necessitate a more or less general answer, however the Bible is very plain on the teaching of staying clear of the entangling sins of the worldly attractions. Let us note a few of the scriptures: First, Ja. 1: 7, Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, to visit the fatherless and widows in their afflictions and to keep himself unspotted from the world. Now this should be plain enough for any to understand that we as Christians can't hold to God with one hand and the Devil's soul-damning helltraps with the other; but just in case you can't understand the language of that verse we give you this one, Ja. 4:4, Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God? Whospever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God. 1 Jn. 2:15, Love not the world neither the things that are in the world, if any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

Q. WHAT IS THE SCARLET BEAST SPOKEN OF IN REV. 17:3?

17:3?

A. This question properly answered, would require more time than we can devote to it at this particular time, however we

shall endeavor to give a brief explanation of the context: Let us read the preceeding verses; first let us remember that to Daniel by Visions and interpretations and John by revelations was shown the world empires from the time immediately after the flood, i.e. the building of the Tower of Babel which was the founding of the old Assyrian world empire and the the first in the ages of human government (explain) down through all the successive Empires which were to be seven in all and to close this age of human governemnt with the Revived Roman Empire which will be in existence at the time of the personal return of Jesus to this earth to put down all earthly or human governments. Let us note now as we revert to the question that the woman which is riding on this scarlet beast has committed fornication or rather the kings of the earth have committed fornication with her; Bear this in mind we go further with thought. Who are the Kings of the earth? Generally speaking, the heads of the 7 world empires; however, show me the king or ruler of the Gentile nations which has not become infatuated with this Harlot which is nothing but false religion and modern churchanity. Under Pacific Stars

(A Marine's Last Letter To Mother and Dad)

On November 22, 1943, under the stars of an alien sky somewhere in the South Pacific, Phillip Welsher, 22, of the United States Marines, breathed his last. Mother and Dad and beloved home were far away; horror, violence and devastation were all around. But Phil was "Looking up" far beyond the stars into the face of his Savior.

Phil's last message to his Mother and Dad (5049 W. Crystal St., Chicago) was written more than a year before his death. His pals found it among his few possessions and mailed it home at once as requested on the envelope. He wrote:

Somewhere in the Pacific Sept. 16, 1942

Dear Folks:

I am writing this letter in the hope that after my death it will be forwarded to you. My purpose in writing this is twofold. First, that you may be assured that, while we are temporarily separated, we know that we shall soon be joined together with Christ in the presence of God. As I write this I am in very little danger, but who can tell what the morrow may bring? We simply trust in God to give us the victory in temporal things as well as in spiritual matters.

As I pass on, I wish to leave behind me a testimony of the saving Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that God may be glorified in my death more than He was in my life. Today, knowing that I may

very soon be called to give an account of myself, I can say that I am trusting only in Jesus Christ, who died as a sacrifice for my sins that I might have eternal life. He paid the price with His own precious blood, and by faith in Him I am cleansed from all unrighteousness.

I am now with Jesus, and all is well with my soul. Jesus said "I am the resurrection and the Life: He that believeth in me, though he were dead yet shall he live; and whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die." Jn. 11:25-26.

My second purpose in writing this letter, Dad, is that you might make the way of salvation clear to a friend to whom I have written a similar letter. Give the message as from me that "Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures; and that He was buried and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures." I Cor. 15:3-4. Say, also, that in Him we shall all meet again.

Dry your tears Mom; a son has been called home, where He waits to be joined by the dearest parents a boy could have. Perhaps consolation may be found in knowing that when we shall again be together, it shall be even as He has promised: "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain, for the former things are passed away." Re. 21:4.

My life and the lives of my Buddies have not been given in vain. We have fought and died to maintain those God-given liberties with which we have been blessed. Now, for just a little while I would say, Good-bye, and God be with you till we meet again.

evil whether in Germany or in America and the Bible teaches the equality of men. *if all men* will obey him, if not, those who do not, will suffer his judgments.

For the basis of the above statements we quote the following:

"The Lord looketh from heaven; He beholdeth all the sons of men. He fashioneth their hearts alike; He considereth all their works. Psa. 33:13-15.

So we see that it is their works which matters to the Creator.

And again quoting from Ac. 17: "God made the world and all things that are therein, - - - And hath made of one blood all nations of men for to dwell on all the face of the earth.

God hath showed me that I should not call any man common or

unclean. Ac. 10:28.

Duties of A Good Citizen

Paul is one of the great examples of the Bible in citizenship as in many other things, yet we find that it was not always possible to keep the entire ordinances of the day in which he lived, but occasionally stepped aside from those things to keep the commandments of God. Yet he was one of the truly great teachers on Social Life and Citizenship.

We find him instructing Titus on this matter with these words: Put them in mind to be subject to principalities and powers, to obey magistrates, to be ready to every good work, -- To speak evil of no man, to be no brawlers, but gentle shewing all meekness to all men. Ti. 3:1.

Then to Timothy this admonition which surely should be stressed

today in behalf of our rulers.

I exhort - - that first of all supplications, prayers, intercessions and giving of thanks be made for all men; For kings and for all that

are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and a peaceable life in all godliness and honesty, 1 Tim. 2:1-2.

Courtesu

I suppose we are inclined as we pass the milestones of the years of our life to look at the shortcomings of the rising generation because we have already come part of the way with the great teacher, Experience and perhaps learned some things the hard way to say; the younger set are not what we were; Yet surely it is true that certain virtues are disappearing from the social life of today: And among them Courtesy to all men and honour our elders.

Courtesy not only repays in rich dividends from a natural standpoint but is also so closely related to the Golden rule that we should always remember the words of Peter on this: "Be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren, be pitiful, be

courteous.

Hospitality

Many incidents in the Bible show the need of being hospitable and many are the opportunities to increase in this virtue yet it is easy to be so self-centered that we hardly have time to think of others or show the interest in our fellow-men that we should. Perhaps, I say perhaps this condition does not manifest itself in other churches but I confess I have seen the tendency in my field of labour that our church folks are not as ready to associate with the folks from the church down the way as they are with the folks who attend our church. If this condition can find place in lives of the church people what can we expect of the outsiders who are not under the influences of church.

Let us again note the words of Holy Writ: "Use hospitality one to another without grudging. As every man hath received the gift even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the

manifold grace of God. 1 P. 4:9.

Neighbors

Perhaps without turning to the recordings of the parable of the Good Samaritan to decide who our neighbors are we may briefly mention the place neighborliness holds in Citizenship.

I have wondered sometimes if some of the things we have read in our Good Neighbor exploits have not been motivated by the desire to use our neighbor nations to our advantage rather than a desire to be of help to them whether we receive anything in return or not. I have

seen that happen with individuals sometimes.

The commandment of the royal law "To love our neighbor as ourself has been an obstacle very hard to surmount for many, many peple. It is yet a commandment to be observed in spite of all the failures to do so and many will be the needs to observe it in the future. individually and collectively as we view the conditions which shall follow this time of war and suffering. How great will be the responsibility that shall rest upon the Spiritual structure and the church in this? A question impossible to fully answer now but we must accept the responsibility.

Tolerance

A good citizen must be tolerant of the actions and views of his fellow men; to come a little closer to where we live may I make the statemeent: there is a tendency in our church not to tolerate the other fellow's belief or work, but to segregate ourselves too much. I can't think that we should compromise with evil to be tolerant but with charity to all men be an example to he world of this part of citizenship.

Jesus gave us the example of this in the recordings of John. John said: "Master we saw one casting out devils in thy name; and we forbade him, because he followeth not with us." Jesus said unto him, "Forbid him not: For he that is not against us is for us."

It is my sincere opinion that in the not too far distant future conditions will arise which will make us appreciate our fellow-Chris-

tians more than ever before, regardless of church affiliations.

Then if for no other reason we are too busy trying to save the lost through the gospel to spend the time judging our fellow-men. Hear Paul again on this matter: "Why dost thou judge thy brother? or why dost thou set at nought thy brother? For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. Let us not therefore judge one another any more."

The Christian In War

Since we have thus far based the thought of good citizenship on Christianity as the foundation then we digress from the direct subject to briefly express the things we feel as concerns the Christian in

War.

I realize this is a very controversial matter with which to deal but I hope I am Christian enough to practice the thing which I preached only a moment ago: Namely that I can tolerate the other fellow's belief in the matter.

We have been confronted many times with this question: How far can a Christian participate in war? My answer from the sincere belief of my heart has been; To stand by our nation and flag in war to the place of actually taking life of our fellow man. Then it is that I must say that I believe these and other scriptures forbid us from taking the life of any man.

"Love your enemies"—can we love some one whose life we would

take?

"If your enemy hunger, feed him-"

Jesus prayed for his enemies—yet had power to destroy them.

"Follow peace with all men-"

The Lord rebuked Peter for defending the dearest thing on earth to him—"He that killeth with the sword must be killed with the sword."

The question is asked sometime, "What if our enemies should at-

tack our homes and churches and schools?"

The Bible has said when a man's ways please the Lord, he maketh

his enemies to be be at peace with him.

If that is true in an individual sense then it is also true in a national manner. Something is lacking in the national life of our country, as a nation we are failing to please God or else his word is untrue.

Then back to the subject: We need and must have Christian cit-

izenship and a peaceful nation to please the Lord.

Many other things could be said about Citizenship from the teachings of the Bible and in these things we have dealt with we have tried to stay with the Bible rather than the popular opinion of today for whatever we may hope for or attain is going to come through the influence and work of Christianity and the Church.

Then may this be our battle cry as ministers, as communities and as a nation: "Back to the Bible and Peace through Christian Citizen-

ship and leadership.'
