Fall is just around the corner and we are busy filling up the library calendar with lots of fun and informational programs in addition to our regular tried and true Giles County Public Library monthly programs. Make sure to keep the enclosed calendars for the months September thru December so you will know what is happening at the library!

In September, October, and November DeeAnn Dean, Health Consultant, will be here on alternating Mondays starting September 9th for Wellness Classes starting at 5:30PM. DeeAnn has 20 years of experience in health consulting. She is President of Vive Academy and creator of Vive Alchemy and an author and speaker.

Miss Susan, Children's Librarian, is busy planning Story Times that are fun, educational, and crafty for the fall season. A sneak peek includes what's cookin', scarecrows, pirates, and apples for September and spiders, monsters, and pumpkins for October. Story times start at 10:15 on Friday mornings. Also, don't forget about LEGO club on the 3rd Friday of each month for school age kids.

Miss Elizabeth, Teen Librarian, has planned some special events for the teenage crowd. AWE: After-School Edge Learning Tablet

I want to introduce our new AWE After School Edge learning tablet. This tablet was made possible by donations made in memory of Brownie Brown. Brownie used to work at the library and she loved children. We thought it fitting to use the money donated in her memory to purchase this wonderful educational tablet designed for school kids aged six to twelve. It will be available to check out and use in the library. The tablet is full of educational titles perfect for education enrichment, homework help and skill reinforcement. The

tablet contains interactive stories; math and problem solving; science and nature; social studies and geography; reading, words and phonics; writing and computer skills; reference; and music and art. The reference tab includes the Encyclopedia Britannica Elementary Library with introductory-level content for students aged 6-10 and the Britannica Student Library with intermediate-level content for students aged 10-14. We have two AWE Early Literacy Stations that are popular with younger kids. They too have numerous educational games for younger ages.
