

Pastor's thoughts....

St. Mark's Siblings in Christ,

By now all of you have heard that I will be retiring as St. Mark's pastor at the end of this month after 15 years of service. This will be my last "Pastor's Thoughts" for the newsletter and so I would like to make these thoughts more personal.

I was a confirmation student when I felt the call to lead in the church. For many years I was able to creatively avoid the call. A widow at age 50, I began the journey to seminary and God made the pathway straight. I was blessed to spend 3 years as a student before ordination at St. Mark's. I had no idea how to lead a worship and no preaching classes, so thank you for supporting me as I stumbled through the learning process. Together we designed worship traditions that we pray give glory to God.

As we go down memory lane about our history together as a community in Christ, it is important to be reminded that your new leader(s) will also need your help again in leading the people of St. Mark's. I pray that you will trust in the Lord to raise up new leader(s) for the good of God's people. Leader(s) is plural because you will most likely have an interim pastor assigned while preparing to call a new pastor.

Every church community is a unique family. Believe me when I tell you there are hundreds of books regarding family systems theories of church personalities, and I have read my share. Even with all of that spiritual psychology, no one is prepared when the family is divided or unsettled. Together we have weathered our fair share of disagreements and I pray that St. Mark's has become stronger because of it.

St. Mark's will always be a special place to Oran and me as we met and were married here. We have made so many wonderful friends. Working in community with you, we have been able to practice our faith by helping many of God's people with various needs.

My prayer for you is that you will choose to be a community that focuses on your abundance. So often church communities live in fear and scarcity of what the church used to be. You will now need to decide if you are going to grieve the big church you used to be, or, if you will embrace a newer smaller "thriving" church that God is guiding you to be. I pray that you choose to thrive no matter what the size of the congregation. Trust the Holy Spirit because God is always doing a new thing.

Thank you for allowing me to journey with you in a variety of personal challenges, and celebrate with you the joys of baptisms, first communions, new members, confirmations, and weekly Holy Communion.

Thank you for allowing me to journey with you in times of strife, home visitations, nursing care, hospital visits, and the grief of family death and funeral proceedings.

St. Mark's Council Meeting Minutes **Thursday March 10th**, **2022**, Video Conference

Attending Members: Tracey Anders, Craig Bauling, Merla Brooks, Lisa Hinrichs, Terry Jenkins, Cindy Schryver, Hailey Walker, and Pastor Terrie Wilder

Absent Members: All in attendance.

A devotion was given by Pastor Terrie.

A quorum was declared by Merla Brookes: Vice President

Secretary's Report: Minutes from February's Meeting were reviewed and approved by voice vote.

Correspondence: A thank you from the ELCA for our \$205 donation to Lutheran Disaster Response. The money came from a special collection for the tornado disaster.

Treasures Financial Report: Financial Reports submitted by Lori Christen were discussed. A motion was made to pay our organist \$200 for her Lenten service music. This was approved via voice vote. The reports were approved by voice vote.

Pastor's Report: Pastor announced her retirement from St Mark's as of May 1, 2022. The synod has been informed as have a number of the council members. Pastor has sent a letter to all the congregation members. An announcement will be made on Sunday, March 13th at our church service. Merla suggested a pot luck in late April. Many congratulations were given.

Our next council meeting will be in person on April 7th at 7pm. A synod representative will be here to discuss the call process and answer any questions.

Worship: Pastor reported: Ash Wednesday had 28 attendance and the weekly worship has also been gaining attendance each week. Great blessings! During Lent we are looking at topics of change and how God is always in the change. Children are practicing bells and Beth Wiegmann may be our cantor for Easter. New candles for the candelabra have arrived and will also be presented Easter Morning.

McNamara organ services have sent a letter of estimate for the needed organ repairs. It states 2-3 days of work including the removal of pipes to get back to the chamber where the problem is. Volunteers will be needed to help remove some pipes. Financial estimate is approximately \$1500 to \$2200. This in not urgent but necessary. Cheryl suggested doing it this fall. Discussion was held on having a "building fund special fund raiser". The repair topic was tabled until a future meeting.

Worship and Music Committee: The Worship and Music committee's next meeting is Tuesday May 24th at 3:00pm.

Hospitality Committee: A baptism will be held on March 13th and a confirmation celebration on March 20. Cards for Chelsea Schryver are requested. Cake for both baptisms and confirmation will be provided. The next meeting of the committee will address decorating for the Easter season.

Educational Committee: Sunday school attendance is up. Tracey is doing well with the adult study group. The confirmation group is struggling in attendance, will finish the Old Testament studies soon, and review on Palm Sunday for this year.

Global mission: Members are encouraging donations to the Polo Food Pantry for Lent. The church bulletin will include this Food Pantry needs. Collections of goods will be delivered the Tuesday after Palm Sunday.

Memorial Committee: no report

Property Committee: The committee chair reports: A deep cleaning for the church is needed prior to our Easter services. No date has been set., so discussion on an appropriate date were held. Easter is the 17th of April with decorations being done on the 16th of April. April 9th was agreed upon.

We were inspected by the Polo Fire and Emergency Services organization in February. They suggested we provide a method for access to the church for their teams. One suggestion that was discussed during the inspection was the installation of a Knox box (key holding box). More details regarding pricing and mounting need to be accumulated and shared at the next council meeting.

We have still not received a quote from the last electrician who discussed our requirements. Craig to call the last electrician about a quote.

John Engle is offering boiling training to anyone interested in learning about the boiler and it's maintenance. We discussed the maintenance for humidifiers as well. The council should be looking for people to learn and support maintenance activities.

The church is in need of a new toilet seat in the downstairs men's bathroom. Confusion on whether it's mens or womens bathroom. Craig will look at both bathrooms and repair/replace any defective.

Polo Council of Churches: A next meeting is March 22nd at Faith United Methodist.

Constitution: A special congregational meeting was held March 6th for a final vote of the constitution and its changes. The constitution was voted for approval. The next constitution review is required to begin in Dec 2022 for approval at our 2023 January Congregational Meeting.

Old Business:

New Business: 2022 Crop Walk will be hosted by St Marks Lutheran Church. It will be held on 25th September 2022. Tracey Anders is heading this up.

We discussed the lack of the service presentation via the big screen TV. This has impacted Chelsea Schryver greatly and is clearly missed by many others. Kent Anders managed this process in the past, but health issues prevent him from continuing. Lisa H will look into alternatives and discuss with Pastor Terrie.
