# Pastor's Study Desk Notes

23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time Year A



Matthew 18:15-20

"Father, forgive them, they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). It has always struck me so deeply that Jesus offers forgiveness for the people persecuting & killing Him, even as they are still actively committing sins against Him (& is He forgiving them for sins not even committed yet?) What wondrous love is this! Jesus sets the example of eliminating sin's destructiveness, by purging it completely and continuously from every human heart. Sin is always seeking to get a hold in our heart, either through our own sin or the sin of another person inflicted upon us. This may surprise us, but even the sins of other people can cause harmful effects upon us, by our own participation due to our response to their sin. If someone sins against me, that same sin can doubly damage both that other person and me (through their active harm to me but also lead me to sin passively by my reaction to them). Sin poisons everything it touches. For example, how I respond to a sin committed against me, can add a multiplier-effect to the person's initiating sin (original sin!) Who would have thought, but that other person's sinful act tempts me also to commit sin myself? For example, if their offense against me leads me to nurse a grudge and desire a vindictive punishment against them, then sinful hate has slipped into my heart and whispered sweet vengeance to me. Further, if I entertain such malicious desires, then I am sinning and contributing to more sin in the world. So, Jesus says we have to eliminate such hate and sin even from our own hearts (Matt 5:22 "But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment). That is our responsibility to stop sin's reach into our heart. Jesus doesn't want sin to find any place to root in the human heart. So, Jesus gives a four-step method of forgiveness in today's gospel, to ensure that even the sin of another person doesn't poison us by the hatred it can breed in our own hearts. I don't need to add to another's sin, by brooding on their injury to me and letting that sin additionally corrupt me. When I do that, I am growing sin, letting sin live off my soul's energy, and that takes strength away from any good-will in me. So, Jesus says, "Purge it! Do not allow sin any foothold in your own heart." His command is "Forgive, and forgive and forgive". He offers a fourfold process today, calling us to try and try again to bring about healing and forgiveness. The first step is to try and talk it out one on one. If that doesn't bear fruit, then try another meeting with fair, trusted mutual friends to help mediate a conversation. If that doesn't work, then try asking the church to pray for reconciliation. If that doesn't work, Jesus says that then we should treat them as 'Gentile or tax collector' (Mt 18:17). But that doesn't mean give up on them, because Jesus also said when He was attacked for eating with tax collectors and sinners, He said, "I did not come to calla the righteous but sinners" (Matt 9:13). So, by saying treat them as a 'tax collector or sinner', it simply means that we have to go back to the drawing board and come up with more creative and unique ways to reach out and make peace with our brother!

In fact, the gospel verses immediately following today's reading, is where we hear Peter pop the question to Jesus about just how many times we must forgive. Peter asks, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?" And Jesus answers saying, "Not seven times but seventy-seven times" (Matt 18:21-22). This seemingly exponential number is basically 'infinity', to the moon and back. Jesus is saying, "You just keep on forgiving and I'll let you know when it is enough." Why so much forgiveness? Because to withhold forgiveness means that we then bear the sin ourselves. What do they say about harboring vindictive grudges, but that it is like wishing your neighbor dead, but you are drinking the poison! Yes, if we respond with vengeance, our problem with the neighbor will go away, but only because we are taking ourselves down (the hate will consume us and take us out of the equation). So, Jesus wants His disciples to be agents of forgiveness and reconciliation for others. This is why He calls us to 'love enemies and bless those who persecute you' (Luke 6:27-28). Christ's love can stop and reverse the downward tendency of sin wrecking every heart that it touches, like falling dominoes. Responding with love (forgiveness) subverts the power of sin, and stands against its destructive effects. The forgiveness we see in Christ upon the Cross says 'This sin stops with me.' Jesus steps in between, to mend the harm and convert sin to good. What sin would divide and destroy (our hearts-good and bad), Jesus brings together, mending and healing. As Ephesians 2:14 describes Jesus' Cross and its reconciling effect, it tells us "For Christ is our peace, he who made both one and broke down the dividing wall of enmity, through his flesh...." Love, even of our enemy, both keeps our heart pure and attempts to touch the hardened heart of the sinner to turn it back toward God. Love does that! St Paul says, in 1 Corinthians 13:7-8 "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails." And St Peter tells us in 1 Peter 4:8 "love covers a multitude of sins".

May we, disciples of Jesus, forgive and love like He does us! Peace, Fr Brian
