Model A 's Return to Yellowstone Trail Heritage Day

On Saturday, August 13 the annual Yellowstone Trail Heritage Day event took place in Hudson, Wisconsin and a group of TCMAFC Members participated. The event celebrates the history of the old Yellowstone Trail - the first transcontinental auto route through the northern tier of states. The 3,600-mile network of roads was started in 1912 and stretched from Plymouth Rock, Massachusetts to Puget Sound, Washington. The route passed through St. Croix County in Wisconsin and crossed into Minnesota at Hudson.

Our group was able to display our cars along Second Street and a steady stream of people came by to look at them and ask questions. A lot of photos were taken! In addition to the Model A's, there was a big turnout from the British Sports Car Club, there were some Model T's and a variety of other display cars of various makes and models were there. When the car show ended, there was a Sociability Drive and Poker Run that traced the Yellowstone Trail route through the St. Croix County towns of Hudson, Hammond, Baldwin, and Roberts. Scott and Jody Huberty joined up with a couple that will be joining TCMAFC with their 1931 Tudor and they completed the route. That was a fun time although neither of the couples came up with a winning poker hand!

There are already plans in the works to do the event again next year although a specific date has not yet been determined.









A short review of the costs of our newsletter

The newsletter is an important tool that we use to inform and keep our members connected. Just as there are two ways to start your Model A, use the starter or if you need to you can use the crank. Better engineering (technology) brought to the market the starter. So, you have two options, but one is certainly used more often than the other.

Today technology has brought us to the digital age and there are many adopters. Our newsletter has a strong digital acceptance which allows us to produce color photos and nearly a zero cost of delivery to the club. The members can store the newsletter and print it if they so choose. With our printed version we are spending quite a bit of money on its production. We are also limited to produce printed copies by economically choosing an 8, 12 or 16 page newsletter due to how printing paper goes thru the printing process. We must rely on an independent business to reliably print and mail our product. Like all business sometimes unfortunately our printer can have production problems.

At this time our costs per issue are averaging no less that \$3.30 per issue, should we print a few more 16 page newsletters or postage rises again that cost will increase.

How our money is spent - \$3.30 per issue 12 times a year is equal to \$39.60 for the costs to deliver the newsletter to a member. Our membership dues are \$35.00 per year. With these costs and number of mailed newsletters we are on track to spend no less than \$2772.00 per year for our hard printed copies that get mailed.

Remember the hand crank, although it is useful it is not a long-term solution. Costs, convenience and benefits should be considered.

Members who can accept a digital version are strongly encouraged to do so. At what point a printed version goes away or perhaps an added cost for such delivery to those who receive a printed copy will certainly be a topic of conversation before the board as they decide on how best to use the financial resources of the club in future meetings.

We are starting once again with our clinics. If you are working on something or have completed a task this summer please share what you have done. We are getting new members who want to learn and need guidence. Take photos, write a short summary of what you've done and stand up and tell us how to do it easier, what tricks you can use, the tools you've made or used along with the suppliers of parts that worked out for you.

Since more than one person sends items out via TCMAFC @gmail.com, should you need to contact a person for clarification or assistance your board members, newsletter editor and committee members contacts are listed on the Presidents column page as well as in your membership roster. I appreciate all submissions to the newsletter however in order to give you a quality newsletter I need to have some preparation time to get it all togather.
