Not a Drop to Model

Ewing Row Modeling Project Chair

Water, water, everywhere, Nor any drop to "model."

My apologies to Samuel Taylor Coleridge who said "Nor any drop to drink."

Modeling water is a must for this year's project. Should you have trouble modeling water with the materials provided in the "kit," remember that the "water" provided is Woodland Scenics Realistic Water. You can find it at Madison Hobby Stop or any other hobby store. I even found it at Hobby Lobby. Also, should you ruin the plaster cloth provided or not have enough; it too is Woodland Scenics (C1203) plaster cloth.

Other than the water, the rest of the scenery you put on your diorama can be of any kind. However, most of that proved is Woodland Scenics. buildings, trees, bridges, hand-laid track, anything, can be included. Pay attention to the maximum diorama sizes: 144 square inches for HO scale and 72 inches for N scale.

It is mid-February. April 3rd is coming soon. Good luck with your efforts!

The March Model/Photo Contest theme is: Open Freight Cars. The humble flatcar was one of the first freight cars to be developed by the railroads. It was simple to build and versatile in use. Add ends and sides and it's a gondola. Put a top on it and you have a boxcar.

Open freight cars are great to model or photograph because you get to see the lading as well as the car itself. In this contest, the car can be loaded or empty. When empty, open cars reveal the interior details.

In the modern era, open cars have evolved and become more specialized. There are bulkhead flatcars for lumber, mill gondolas, "flood" coal gondolas, ore and taconite "jimmies". Surprisingly, there is still a place for the humble old flatcar in the twenty-first century.

My wife and I have been rail fans all our lives. I got interested in model trains as a

kid when my dad gave me and my brother his childhood Lionel train set. I spent the first 30 years of my married life intending to build a model railroad. My boys and I went to the train show every couple of years and dreamed of what we could do with half the basement. Time passed, the boys grew up and I found I finally had the time to build a model railroad.

I started the planning a layout about 12 years ago. I'm working in N scale using the WSOR as my prototype. It supports my interest in lots of local freights in limited space, it runs through the town I live in, and I really like the color scheme on their locos. I have what I call my second draft up and running. The third draft is in the planning stage and construction will start in the spring. With each draft it gets bigger.

I joined the NMRA in 2010 to learn from other people with more experience. I have had the honor of serving on the BOD since 2011 as the Clerk and the Superintendent.

My passion for model railroading began in the 1950's as 12 year old building Strombecker wooden freight

cars and built a very, very small railroad. As a competitive athlete through high school and college followed by medical school and orthopedic residency, I had no time to devote to it.

I first joined the NMRA and the SCWD in approximately 1979. In October of 2013, I started building a large HO layout which is now up and running.

I really enjoy the monthly SCWD meetings particularly the clinics but even more the wealth of knowledge and friendships of the members who graciously share their skills and knowledge which I sorely needed and will need more in the future.

Having been elected to the SCWD Board of Directors this past year, I have had the opportunity to become more active in our Division. It was a great eye opener to see how passionate and hardworking the board members were in trying to advance interest, provide more relevant information and make our monthly meetings more meaningful for our membership. I certainly would like to continue on the Board of Directors to help advance the vision of the Division.

In attendance were Directors McGeever, Phil Berry, Phil Hottmann, Bill Clancy, Mike Vivion, John Haverberg and Fred Robinson and guests David Lendved and Jerry Lawler. Bob declared a quorum present.

A motion was made by Fred, seconded by Bill and approved by the Board to accept the minutes of the 12/14/2015 Board Meeting as submitted.

Phil B. presented paymaster's reports for the month of December, 2015. Fred made a motion to accept, Bill seconded and the Board approved the report as presented.

Committee Reports:

Bad Order: Kathy Clancy will work with Paul Mangan on editing the next Bad Order and then take over thereafter. Reports from Board members and Committee Chairs should be sent to Kathy and Paul this month and then just to Kathy after that. As usual, submittals are due by the 14th of the month.

Club Liaison: Suggestion was made to have a list of known model shows and meets in the area published in the September Bad Order each year.

Clinics: In Feb. Sean Lamb will report on Wiki Project Trains and Cheryl Mitchell on the Secret Life of Trains. Fred will do a participation clinic on the making of steel coil loads at the March meeting. Bill Clancy is preparing a clinic on the Bragdon method of scenery building for May.

Contests – model and photography: David Lendved discussed options for updating the award process for model/photo contests at regular meetings. David will provide ballots with models judging on one side and photos on the other. David would like to put winning colored ribbons on the model and photo displays during the meeting. The Board agreed that certificates could be eliminated as long as winner lists were kept and published in the Bad Order.

Layout Tours: Phil said no tours for Feb. (Super Bowl Sunday). March will be Bob McGeever and one or two others. Phil said Paul Nelson and perhaps the Waunakee Station Club would be for April. There will be several in May on the Joint Meeting date with RRVD.

Membership: Paul Mangan has agreed to co-chair the Membership Committee with current chair Larry Enlow.

Picnic: John asked the Board if he should pursue arrangements with Little Amerrika, as the venue, again. Discussion was on alternate sites, but Board agreed that John should make tentative inquiries with Little Amerricka.

Publicity: John reported that notices for all SCWD spring meetings have gone to the hobby magazines.

Rail School: 56 SCWD members and 81 guests attended the function last Sunday. Good reports on the event were received.

Rail Show: Progress is on track. About 300 tables have been sold to date. Bob is looking for SCWD members willing to help with model layout judging at the show. Please contact Bob if interested.

Youth Group: Dan Heller and Steve Brist are looking to arrange a tour of the roundhouse in Janesville. Work on the new HO youth layout is progressing – Bill Marks will help with Kato unit track laying.

Old Business:

1. Red Book: The Red Book, updated for 2016, is being distributed to all SCWD members.

New Business:

- 1. Mike: Any SCWD member can run for election to the Board at the April 3rd meeting and should contact Mike or Bob to get on the ballot. Two positions will be open. Names must be in by early February for bios and pictures to be placed in the March and April Bad Orders.
- 2. Spring banquet will be on Friday, May 13th at the Zor Shrine Center. Catering is yet to be determined.

Adjournment: Bob moved, Fred seconded and the Board approved adjournment at 8:39 pm.

2016 SCWD Railfan Trip

A SCWD sponsored two day railfan trip is tentatively being planned to Rochelle and Galesburg, Illinois for May 20-21. The itinerary will be a repeat of the trip SCWD sponsored in April 2011 as follows: leave Madison at 8:00 am on Friday; stop at Rochelle Railroad Park (viewing of UP & BNSF crossing diamond) in am; lunch in Rochelle; Galesburg by 3:00 pm for railfaning at local park; dinner and overnight in Galesburg; breakfast at motel on Saturday; 9:00 am to noon a tour of BNSF diesel maintenance/repair facility, yard tour, hump tower tour, remote engine demo plus Hwy 10 bridge photo op of the yard; lunch in Galesburg; Galesburg Railroad Museum in afternoon and arrive back in Madison by 6:30 pm. 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

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
