

This April, the troop set off on a fun historical trip to Baltimore's historic Inner Harbor. We left

the cabin at about 6:00PM on Saturday, and after about an hour and a half on the road, we pulled into where we thought we were staying for the night, Camp Horseshoe.

Luckily, nearby Camp Ware was able to accommodate us, and we ended up staying in the permanent cabins in Staff City. Near where we were staying, there was a full lodge, complete with a kitchen.


This sped up cooking considerably, and within an hour of arriving, scouts were making their chicken burritos. After dinner, we had a short campfire, and made our way to bed.

Our first stop was the National Aquarium, a huge sprawling home for tens of thousands of fish and other creatures located right on the harbor. We spent most of the morning making our way through exhibits of everything from piranhas to eels to sharks. They even had some greenhouse habitats with frogs, parrots, and of course, lots of tropical fish.

After the aquarium, groups headed to either Chipotle or Shake Shack for a quick lunch, then we headed onto the second half of our trip, the historic boats. Scattered around the harbor are various Naval vessels ranging from a WWII submarine, an anti-slave trafficking ship from the 1830's, and a Coast Guard guide ship. We were given the opportunity to go aboard 2 of these historic vessels, and of course, re-enact the famous Titanic scene.

After everyone was done touring the ships, we grabbed some snacks for the ride home and got on the bus, arriving back at the cabin at about 5:30PM.

Please make sure the completed health/medical form includes parts A, B1, B2 & C (part C is a pre-participation physical and requires a physician's signature) with a front and back copy of your medical insurance card.



If your scout has special dietary needs or needs to take medication while at camp, a Special Dietary Form and Medication Form are also required and submitted along with the health/medical form by May 13th (forms are available on the Troop website and Camp Horseshoe website).

If you wish to use scout camping account funds to pay for summer camp, please contact Kipp Happ at edhapp@verizon.net. Kipp can provide the current scout account balance and you can instruct him on the amount you would like to use for summer camp.
