Accessibility Statement

1. Accessible documents at Naunton Parish Council

This policy explains how accessible the documents Naunton Parish Council publishes on its website are.

2. Using our documents

Naunton Parish Council publishes documents in a range of formats, but primarily in PDF and in Word. Photographs are included, almost entirely for decorative purposes, and there are no video or audio media.

You should be able to:

- Navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- Zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- Change colours, contrast levels and fonts via your computer settings

To make it easier for everyone to access the information on the website we will, wherever possible:

- tag headings and other parts of the document, so screen readers can understand the page structure
- make sure we include alt text alongside non-decorative images, so people who cannot see them understand their function
- avoid using tables, except when presenting data
- write in plain English.
- provide an HTML option where possible and where the amount of effort required is appropriate to the document and its use.

AbilityNet has advice on making your device easier to use if you have a disability.

3. How accessible are our documents

Some parts of this website may not be fully accessible:

- many documents accessed via the website are in pdf format or have been scanned or photocopied to ensure they cannot be changed. This includes:
 - Agendas, Minutes and Clerks Reports
 - Annual Governance and Reporting Documents
 - Newsletters
 - Procedures and policies
- some text and links may have poor colour contrast

7. Technical information about the accessibility of this website

Naunton Parish Council is committed to making its documents accessible in accordance with the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

This website is partially compliant with the <u>Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version</u> <u>2.1</u> AA standard, due to the non-compliances listed below.

8. Non accessible content

The content outlined below is non-accessible for the reasons specified.

8.1 Non compliance with the accessibility regulations

Some documents are in scanned pdf format or have been photocopied to ensure they cannot be changed or to include signatures which are a legal requirement. These include:

- Agendas, Minutes and Clerks Reports
- Annual Governance and Reporting documents (AGARs)
- Newsletters
- Procedures and policies.

Scanned PDF documents do not comply with the Accessibility Regulations 2018 but these documents can be provided in an alternative format or on alternative media on request.

A few documents include images which do not have a text alternative, so the information in them is not available to people using a screen reader. This does not

meet WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.1.1 (non-text content). However, these are purely decorative and do not form part of the information contained in the webpages.

8.2 Disproportionate burden

Naunton Parish Council believes that it would be a disproportionate burden on the Council to provide all documents (post September 2018) in an accessible format as the Council has limited financial and other resources. In addition, web page access levels are very low.

8.3 Content that's not within the scope of the accessibility regulations The accessibility regulations do not require the Council to make PDFs or other documents published before 23 September 2018 accessible if they're not essential to providing our services.

9. Preparation of this accessibility statement

This statement was prepared on 18th August 2020. It is due for review at the next Parish Council meeting, currently scheduled for 21st September 2020. It will be reviewed annually along with other PC procedural documents.

Naunton Parish Council used the methodology described in "Website Accessibility Requirements" produced by <u>NALC</u>. This website was tested using the <u>Microsoft Accessibility Insights for Web</u> tool recommended in that publication. I
