REACH, Inc. – Community Outreach

Staff are requesting Clorox swipes, cleaning supplies and laundry detergent for the Safe House.

As the staff travel to the schools to discuss domestic violence, they have identified a need for children’s underwear and socks of varying sizes. They have also adopted some families to help as well. If you have items of clothing (clean and in good condition), children’s books, etc. to donate please place them in the blue bin located in the pantry. Check out the clearance section at Walmart next time you go shopping.

Stacy can always use some **small tote bags** and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. travel size shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, tooth paste, travel size deodorant, hand sanitizer, etc. She is having difficulty finding small bottles of hand sanitizer so next time you go shopping pick up a few bottles..

Please contact the REACH office staff if you have furniture you want to donate to arrange pickup by the Thrift Store volunteers. They also ask for cooking utensils for helping them start over. So, if you have something you no longer want, they could use them. Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes, furniture, and items for the home from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They also can use items to help their self-esteem and pass the time until they can be placed in a safe environment. You can provide puzzles (500 pieces or less), adult

coloring books, reading material, make-up, nail polish, hair clips, etc.

Volunteers and donors are always needed. Call the office at 828-837-2097 or 828-837-8064 for more information. Local REACH covers Cherokee and Graham County.

The truth is many of us are woefully unaware of the depth, breadth, and relevance of Black history. While we still work to remind our loved ones and colleagues that the need for racial justice is as present and persistent as ever, it's also difficult for us to

comprehend just how recently so much of Black history has taken place.

It wasn't until 1976 that Black History Month was officially recognized. So, it's safe to say we have a lot of catching up to do — as a society, and as individuals.

Let's look at some of those contributions:

Adam Clayton Powell

(Nov. 29, 1908 – April 4, 1972)
He was the first person of African American descent to be elected from New York to Congress. In 1961, after sixteen years in the House, Powell became chairman of the Education and Labor Committee, the most powerful position held by an African American in Congress.

Alexander Murray Palmer Haley

(August 11, 1921 – February 10, 1992)
Alex was an American writer known as the author of the 1976 book Roots: The Saga of an American Family.

Benjamin Banneker

(November 9, 1731 – October 9, 1806)
Banneker's knowledge of astronomy helped him author a commercially successful series of almanacs. He corresponded with Thomas Jefferson, drafter of the United States Declaration of Independence, on the topics of slavery and racial equality. Abolitionists and advocates of racial equality promoted and praised his works.

Bessie Coleman

(January 26, 1892 – April 30, 1926)
She was an American civil aviator. She was the first female pilot of African American descent and is also the first Native American woman to hold a pilot license.

Bessie Smith

(April 15, 1894 – September 26, 1937)
Nicknamed The Empress of the Blues, Smith was the most popular female blues singer of the 1920s and 1930s. She is often regarded as one of the greatest singers of her era and, along with Louis Armstrong, a major influence on other jazz vocalists.
