**From the Pastor's Desk:**

Dear Parishioners,  
 I thought it would be beneficial to share some of my personal history with you. I am the seventh of nine children - six boys, three girls. While growing up, my family lived in a small tenement house owned by my parents in the old textile village of Manville, Rhode Island. My brothers and sisters and their spouses still live in the same village. All four grandparents were born in French speaking Canada and moved to Rhode Island and nearby Massachusetts in their youth.

The local parish community of Saint James, Manville, played an important role in my family's life. It was the place of spiritual enrichment as well as social activities. As a teenager it was my second home. I attended the local Catholic grammar school and public middle and high school. After high school, I attended Rittner's School for Floral Design and worked as a cook in a nursing home for ten years.

I joined the Capuchins at the age of twenty-five. While in my formational years as a Capuchin I lived in several places: Garrison, NY, Manchester, NH, Calvary Station, WI, Orange, NJ and Talofofo, Guam. I received both my bachelor's and master's degrees from Seton Hall University. My first assignment, after ordination, was to serve as parochial associate for the yoked parishes of St. Ann and St. Augustine, in Manchester, NH. Ten months after ordination, I was asked to take on the pastorship of Saint Joseph's in New Paltz, NY. The University of New Paltz, tourism, and the local apple orchards were the main employment opportunities for parishioners of the large rural parish with its enrollment of five hundred children in the religious education program.

After serving in New Paltz for nine years, it was the provincial desire that I take on the responsibility of being the pastor of The Monastery Church of the Sacred Heart in Yonkers, New York. Sacred Heart is the central meeting place for the Capuchin Province of Saint Mary. Most of the religious professions, ordinations and funerals for the friars take place at Sacred Heart. The large complex with its grade school, high school, and monastery provide ample space for such gatherings. After reaching my term limit as pastor in Yonkers, it was again the desire of the provincial that I relocated to Rutland for the purpose of building up the Capuchin presence in Vermont.

For the last ten months I have been living in community with Fr. Thomas Houle, OFM Cap. at Saint Peter's Friary in Rutland and have ministered both at Saint Peter's Church and Saint Alphonsus Church in Pittsford. When offered the opportunity by Bishop Coyne to serve as pastor of Our Lady of Good Help and Saint Alphonsus I gladly accepted. I look forward to this new adventure. Two parishes with three worship cites: Saint Agnes, Saint Alphonsus and Saint Mary's presents some challenges, but with God's grace and the great hospitable people that you are, I am confident that we will overcome these struggles and be better for it.
