3. Financial Reports

- Local Drug Free Communities Fund
 - o 2019 collections: March: \$5,754.14, YTD: \$12,374.71
 - o 2019 expenditures: See Treasurer's Report
- **4.** News Around the State and Nation: The report was attached to the agenda.
 - April is Alcohol Awareness Month, which provides an opportunity to increase awareness and understanding of alcohol use disorder and recovery.
 - Young adults under age 35 account for half of emergency room visits due to nonmedical prescription drug use.
 - A new study finds that while reducing opioid prescriptions can save lives, it also can lead to increased heroin use and deaths.
 - More than 150,000 Americans died from alcohol, drugs and suicide in 2017 the highest number since the federal government started collecting such data in 1999.

5. Grantee Report: North Adams Community Schools

- The goal of the NACS random drug testing policy is to identify students who are using controlled substances and ultimately prevent the use of such substances.
- 60 students have been tested to date this year.
- At Bellmont, there is a 98% participation rate in the random drug testing pool.

6. Grantee Report: Drug Court

- Drug Court has been operating since 2015.
- 11 participants have graduated, which is 62.5%.
- There were 28 participants in 2018.
- Grant funds were utilized to for a portion of the Coordinator's salary, compliance officer services, drug testing supplies, and incentives.
- Jaime Loshe is the new Drug Court Case Manage/ High& Moderate Risk Probation Officer.

7. DFAC Business/Discussions

Grant process reopening for Prevention funds

- Grants will be due 5/22/19 at noon.
- o Current grantees can apply.

AIM Grant

- o Grant opportunity referred by Mayor Meyer.
- This application was completed with assistance from Melissa Norby for \$5,000 for resources to be distributed in the community.

• Restoring Community Symposium

- Coalition members were invited to attend this May 21, 2019 event.
- Admission is free and limited to 150 participants.

• Recovery House

- There was no March or April meetings. The next meeting is May 14.
- Oxford House requires transportation to be available. Wes reported there is a potential for Lyft drivers to fill this need. A call-out meeting is scheduled for 6/19/19.
- Bob Corral asked if bikes from Decatur PD would be available. Leonard Corral reported that some bikes may be available.

• Communities Talk: Town Hall Meetings to Prevent Underage Drinking Initiative

- Curtis Rose recounted the loss of his daughter.

• What drug/alcohol issues are you seeing?

- Amanda Gilbert reported that marijuana is a problem for the schools. Students are smoking marijuana with their parents.
- While cigarettes are less of an issue for schools, Juuls are a problem.
- Ian Gilbert added that individuals are traveling to Michigan to purchase marijuana. Drug-related OWIs are increasing.
- Fentanyl, meth, cocaine, and THC with fentanyl are also prevalent.
