# Vitamins Are Either Fat soluble or Water Soluble. What Does This Mean?

A fat soluble vitamin (A, D, E and K) must be dissolved in body fat before your body can use it. An excess of any one of these vitamins is stored in fat tissues and the liver until needed and not excreted in urine. These vitamins do not need to be consumed every day as long as your regular diet has some each week.

Water soluble vitamins (B complex and C) are dissolved in water and are not stored by your body. Excess amounts of these vitamins will be excreted in your urine. Because of this you should, if possible, eat foods with these every day.

To help preserve the vitamin content in your food, refrigerate fresh produce and keep dairy products and grain out of bright light.

The medical community debates about the need for vitamin supplements, in particular multivitamins. In general, if your diet contains plenty of fruits and vegetables and other vitamin rich foods, you may not need vitamin supplements. If your diet lacks the vitamin rich foods, supplements may be helpful. Talking with your doctor and maybe a dietition may help you decide whether you need any supplements or maybe just a change in your diet that will provide the necessary nutrients your body needs.
