the Holy Spirit. John the Baptist, his cousin, on the right, is baptizing Him in the Jordan River. John is holding a staff in the shape of a cross and is dressed in a robe of camel's hair, a symbol of penitential life in the desert.

John tried to prevent Him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" Jesus said to him in reply; "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness."

his panel shows the instruments of the passion. The lance, used to



pierce Jesus' side after His death.

John 19:34. The sponge soaked in vinegar, "They stuck a sponge soaked in this wine on some hyssop and raised it to His lips." John 19:29

The hammer, used to nail His hands and feet. John 20:25,27

The pliers, used to pull out the nails when taking the dead body of Jesus down from the cross.

he west side windows within the body of the church depict the five Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary.

The first is the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead. The guards, posted at the order of the

Sanhedrin, are present.

Above is the symbol, "MR" which means, "Maria Regina", or Mary the Queen.
