**REACH, Inc. – Community Outreach**

**Staff are requesting Clorox swipes, cleaning supplies and laundry detergent for the Safe House.**

As the staff travel to the schools to discuss domestic violence, they have identified a need for children’s underwear and socks of varying sizes. They have also adopted some families to help as well. If you have items of clothing (clean and in good condition), children’s books, etc. to donate please place them in the blue bin located in the pantry. Check out the clearance section at Walmart next time you go shopping.

Stacy can always use some **small tote bags** and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. travel size shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, tooth paste, travel size deodorant, hand sanitizer, etc. She is having difficulty finding small bottles of hand sanitizer so next time you go shopping pick up a few bottles..

Please contact the REACH office staff if you have furniture you want to donate to arrange pickup by the Thrift Store volunteers. They also ask for cooking utensils for helping them start over. So, if you have something you no longer want, they could use them. Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes, furniture, and items for the home from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They also can use items to help their self-esteem and pass the time until they can be placed in a safe environment. You can provide puzzles (500 pieces or less), adult

coloring books, reading material, make-up, nail polish, hair clips, etc.

Volunteers and donors are always needed. Call the office at 828-837-2097 or 828-837-8064 for more information. Local REACH covers Cherokee and Graham County.

Women's History Month had its origins as a national celebration in 1981 when Congress passed Pub. L. 97-28 which authorized and requested the President to proclaim the week beginning March 7, 1982, as "Women's History Week." Throughout the next five years, Congress continued to pass joint resolutions designating a week in March as "Women's History Week." In 1987 after being petitioned by the National Women's History Project, Congress passed Pub. L. 100-9 which designated the month of March 1987 as "Women's History Month." Between 1988 and 1994, Congress passed additional resolutions requesting and authorizing the President to proclaim March of each year as Women's History Month. Since 1995, presidents have issued a series of annual proclamations designating the month of March as "Women's History Month." These proclamations celebrate the contributions women have made to the United States and recognize the specific achievements women have made over the course of American history in a variety of fields.

The Code Girls or World War II Code Girls is a nickname for the **more than 10,000 women who served as cryptographers (code makers) and cryptanalysts (code breakers)** for the United States Military during World War II, working in secrecy to break German and Japanese codes. They have only

recently been given permission to talk about their role during the war but unfortunately none of them lived to receive recognition and credit for their critical role in winning the war.

**Black female WWII unit recognized with congressional honor.**

The 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion was credited with solving a mail crisis in England and being a role model to generations.
