July 28, 2019 Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Lk 11:1-13

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Teach us to pray! Those words were the title of the first book I read in the seminary that I didn't have to read for class! Fr Andre' Louf (a Cistercian monk) wrote the small book (130 pages) as an introduction to prayer. Fr Louf emphasized that genuine prayer must be personal and integral. He meant that fruitful prayer engages the whole person, and that a person has to bring all one's self into prayer. In addition to such self-honesty, he added that discipline and faithfulness reliably bring the most spiritual fruit for one's efforts. Keep the time, and the time will keep you. We must maintain daily periods of dedicated listening time for God. The fullest example of consecrating time to God in the Church is what clergy, nuns, monks and religious call the Liturgy of the Hours (or Divine Office). Each period and stage of the day (The Hours) has a special prayer focus on particular scriptures and psalms. Yet, Fr. Andre also introduced me to the family of Desert Fathers and Mothers, who were an early church group of men and women dedicated to living in the solitude of the desert, away from the busyness and commerce of the cities. These spiritual workers kept constant focus on 'God-Awareness' and came to true knowledge of themselves and God. Of course, prayer was their primary task, but they eagerly took up manual work with individual trades like processing papyrus or making baskets (any suitable workcraft). They are an intriguing group of early Christians. The Desert Father Teachings are a great resource of 'spiritual parables' and 'enlightening experience stories' (check them out by any internet searching for simply 'Desert Fathers'-the easiest to find hardcopy book is the one edited by Sr. Benedicta Ward). Here are a few examples of their 'sayings': 1) Abba Bessarion was asked, "How do I pray?" And he answered, "Be like the angels of Ezekiel, be all eyes" Watch yourself that you do not sin against God and another person." 2) Or about Abba Agatho, when it was asked how he kept such a humble attitude and never gossiped, the answer came that for three years in training, he kept a stone in his mouth to teach himself silence. 3) Mother Syncletica said, "There are many who live in the mountains and behave as if they were in the town, and they are wasting their time. It is possible to be a solitary in one's mind while living in a crowd, and it is possible for one who is a solitary to live in the crowd of his own thoughts."

Anyway, this is a long introduction from me to get around to my point that many of us may struggle with praying, asking questions like 'How do you start-What do you say?" or 'How can I pray better?' Well, the first step is simply 'doing something'. Jump in, and at least start, by keeping a dedicated time to sit quietly with God, reading scripture or invoking any memorized verses or ritual prayers, using music to concentrate on God's presence, journaling any of your internal thoughts or dialogue, or reviewing your day and emptying your heart of worries/concerns. Keep in mind, that if you struggle with prayer, you are in good company. Imagine today's gospel reading. The very disciples of Jesus have to ask Him how to pray. These are disciples who have been with Him awhile now. They have listened to his teaching, studied Torah Scripture with him, and been to the Temple and synagogues with him many times. If they needed to ask about praying better or praying at all, then we should not judge ourselves harshly for trying to better or deepen our prayer. As a human expression of us, prayer must be personal, so it must fit you and be natural to you. Jesus prayed alone and with others. He prayed in village synagogues and at the Temple. He prayed in homes and in mountain gardens. He prayed with words, and He prayed with groans. He prayed spontaneously from his heart. He recited scripture prayers. He sang others' songs, and He prayed in Silence. There are so many ways. To help us, Jesus provides a model of prayer with the 'Our Father'. I love how the bible gives us two versions of the 'Our Father'. Today we hear Luke's version (Luke 11:2-4) but you can refer to Matthew's version, too, in Mt 6:9-15 which is a little longer having more details. Having two versions in the Bible tells me to relax about my ever offering a 'perfect' one size fits all prayer. So when I hear the 'Lord's Prayer, I hear Jesus teach that God alone is holy and that God's prime directive to us all is that we unite ourselves to His Will & His Kingdom. Next, I need to be content with today, fully aware of the present moment and grateful for today's blessed bread. I need to stay willing to forgive others and be slow about judging harshly the intentions of others, and keep within my own lane (aware that every day is full of spiritual risks). It sounds simple enough saying it like that, but the real fruit of prayer is if I fulfill it by accomplishing such practices every day.
