I was born on June 19, 1924 (along with my twin brother) to Mena and Harry Moehle of Macon. I was named Hubert. My father was a mail carrier and my mother was a homemaker and caregiver to me, my brother and my four sisters.

I went to high school here in Macon. While in high school I got \$10 for a paper route that I then ran. I would get up at 3 in the morning and deliver

three different papers till about seven, in just enough time for a quick breakfast before school. When I was a senior in high school, I met a freshman named Helen. After I graduated I went into the Army. I was in the Army from 1943-1946. Helen wrote to me every day that I was gone.

I was seasick from the time I got on the Queen Mary until the day after Christmas. I took the Queen Mary to England, which took nine days. Then I took a different boat to Iceland. I spent most of my time there while I was in the service repairing telephones. They would bring broken telephones by the truckload and there was just one other guy and myself fixing them.

I was transferred some while in the service. In fact, I was in Salt Lake City when I got the word that the war was going to end. I got home in April, and Helen and I wed on June 22, 1946. We lived here in Macon. I had several jobs, from driving tractors for a local farmer, to being a bookkeeper, to working at the Coco-Cola bottling company. I finally found my calling as a rural postmaster. I started as a substitute clerk, but soon I had my own route. I bought a jeep off of the guy that was doing the route. I enjoyed carrying and delivering mail until my retirement in 1982.

Helen and I had two children. Our son, David, lives in Kansas City, Missouri and has a son of his own. Our daughter, Connie, lives in Washington and has two sons. We are very proud of the family we have together.

After my retirement, I became busy with a hobby of refinishing furniture. I was pretty good at it. I helped my son by rejuvenating a lot of furniture, enough to fill a 10-room house! But, I had to give up this hobby because of a few lung problems.

It was soon after that, that I found my new hobby by reading an

ad that said, "Learn to Play the Saw". I recalled a time when I was a young boy of five when a tramp came to church. The man told a woman that if she would feed him he would play the saw at church. I really have always liked music. He played so well, too. Because of this memory, I decided to try my hand at playing the saw. I soon sent away for my own musical saw kit from Mussehl and Westphal.

I didn't want anyone to know of my intentions until I could play the saw decently, so I hid the purchase and my practicing from everyone, even my wife and children. The instruction sheet said that I could play the saw in 30 minutes. It took me six weeks just to get a tone! I was about to send the darn thing back. It still took three weeks after that to get on to it. I wasn't ready to play for anyone for several years, but I never gave up.

After my first performance, word of my saw playing traveled quickly. I spent the next 30 years playing for church groups, clubs, friends and family. I have also been recognized in magazines and newspapers.

In October 2014 I came to Loch Haven to live. I have had several bouts with cancer and a knee done. I couldn't get up and down the stairs without help in our home. But I enjoy it here at Loch Haven. I especially like the church services and the singing programs that they provide. Helen comes to visit almost every day. In June we will be married 70 years. I am very lucky.

Strawberry Tunnel Cream Cake

12 oz prepared angel food cake 2 (3 oz) pkg cream cheese, softened 14 oz can Sweetened Condensed Milk 1/3 cup Lemon Juice

- 1 tsp almond extract
- 1 cup chopped fresh strawberries
- 1 large container Cool Whip
- 2-4 drops red food coloring

Invert cake onto serving plate. Cut 1-inch slice crosswise from top of cake; set aside. With sharp knife, cut around cake 1 inch from

center hole and 1 inch from outer edge, leaving cake walls 1inch thick. Remove cake from center, leaving 1-inch thick base on bottom of cake. Tear removed cake into bite-size pieces; reserve. In mixing bowl, beat cheese until fluffy. Beat in sweetened condensed milk until smooth. Stir in lemon juice. almond extract and food coloring. Stir in reserved torn cake pieces, chopped strawberries, and 1 cup whipped topping. Fill cake cavity with strawberry mixture; replace top of cake. Frost with remaining whipped topping. Chill 3 hours or freeze 4 hours. Garnish with strawberries if desired.

Field Greens With Oranges, Strawberries And Vanilla Vinaigrette

Vanilla Vinaigrette:

1/3 cup olive oil 3 tablespoons white wine vinegar

1 tsp. vanilla extract 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon sugar 1/4 teaspoon pepper Mix all ingredients with wire whisk until well blended.

Salad:

1 package (6 ounces) field greens or baby spinach leaves

2 seedless oranges, peeled and sectioned 2 cups strawberry halves or slices 1/2 cup toasted pecan pieces Toss together in large bowl. Serve with vinaigrette.

Bacon Mushroom Swiss Chicken

3 slices of bacon, crisply cooked, crumbled and drippings reserved

6 boneless, skinless chicken breasts 4 oz can sliced mushrooms, drained 10.75 oz can cream of chicken soup

6 slices of Swiss cheese

Pour reserved bacon grease in a skillet and heat up over medium heat. Place chicken breasts in the warmed grease and cook for 3-5 minutes until slightly golden (turning once). Spray crock pot with cooking spray. Put chicken in crock pot. Cover



with mushrooms. Pour soup in skillet, warm through, then pour over chicken. Cover and cook on low for 5 hours. Place a slice of Swiss on top of each chicken breast, sprinkle with bacon, turn heat up to high and cover and cook for 10-15 minutes more until the cheese is melted.

Flaky Tomato & Mozzarella Tart

1/2 sheet puff pastry

1 cup cherry tomatoes (halved)

1 cup grated mozzarella

1 tablespoon olive oil salt and black pepper

Heat oven to 425° F. On a lightly floured surface, roll the puff pastry into a 9-by-6-inch rectangle. Place on a parchment-lined baking sheet and refrigerate until firm, at least 30 minutes. Prick the puff pastry all over with a

fork and top with the tomatoes and mozzarella. Drizzle with the oil and season with ½ teaspoon salt and ¼ teaspoon pepper. Bake until golden brown and cooked through, 20 to 25 minutes. Cut into pieces before serving. Yummy!!!
