

Stephanie Hass: "My name is Stephanie Hass. I have lived in Broomfield, Colorado since 1975. I am married to David Hass. We have raised our children here and we are now empty nesters. I have been a nurse practitioner with TruCare Hospice since 2000. My primary focus now has been as a grief and trauma counselor for the last four years working with all ages, ethnicities, and socioeconomic status.

I have been a volunteer as well as a tester for Alliance of Therapy Dogs (ATD) for 30 years. I have served as a volunteer at our church in feeding the high school kids, Awana, Operation Christmas Child, and assisting the elderly who are in need. I have visited many different assisted living homes, hospitals and DIA, with my therapy dogs. I have

volunteered with the Senior Broomfield Community to help meet seniors daily and weekly needs for several years now.

In my spare time, I love hiking with my dogs, camping, sewing, reading and enjoying our beautiful state of Colorado. I have traveled to all fifty states and other countries. In 2019, I visited Denali National Park which concluded my goal of visiting all our National Parks. This achievement was exciting for me. I am a retired colonel with 25 years of service to the United States Army.

I would like to continue to be effective within our Broomfield Community with individuals of all ages as a volunteer. I look forward to volunteering and assisting in any capacity with Broomfield Council on the Arts & Humanities."



Hunter Mack: Hunter is a classically trained multi-instrumentalist who teaches out of his home studio in Longmont, Colorado. He studied classical guitar performance, composition, and music theory at Metropolitan State University. When Hunter is not teaching one of his many instruments, he manages his family's farm, providing organically grown produce to local food banks and families in need. Hunter is also the Program Director of BCAH's newest program in development scheduled to launch in Q2 2022, Music for All Colorado.

Q: Tell us a bit about Music for All Colorado. How did you get started?

A: I was struggling with isolation at the start of the pandemic, so I reached out on social media offering free online music lessons. I thought it would be a productive way to remain social and share my love of music. I expected to hear back from maybe five

people, but two days later I had around 2,000 emails in my inbox. The Music for All initiative was born. I got to work organizing teachers and pairing them with students. I'm not even sure what our combined impact was, but by the end of 2021 I personally had provided over 1,000 hours of lessons to people all over the world. After seeing how much this initiative helped people through such a difficult period, I wanted to take that momentum and refocus it on my community. Music for All Colorado will be organizing volunteer teachers to provide highly discounted and free music lessons to economically underprivileged youth in the Front Range area, as well as providing scholarships to help students engage with local teaching studios. Quality, private music education should not be exclusive to economically privileged individuals, and I look forward to making that a reality in Broomfield.

Q: So why nonprofit work? Why BCAH?

A: There are many different ways to measure success. I like to judge my success based on the community in which I live. If the community is not thriving, then I do not feel like I'm succeeding as an individual. That's what inspires me to engage in nonprofit work. BCAH is a natural fit. The first time I met Keri Dillingham, our Executive Director, she spoke about how the arts and humanities are basic needs. They are just as important as food and water in creating a thriving community. I knew instantly that this was the kind of organization I wanted to work with. I'm also impressed by the talent on the Board of Directors. They have a diverse skill set and are very passionate about their mission. (con't on next page)

A Broomfield Community Players' Murder Mystery

Rehearsal for Murder is a murder mystery set in the theatre world with plenty of twists and turns. On the opening night of a poorly-reviewed play, the lead actress, Monica Welles, dies in an apparent suicide. The playwright/Monica's fiancé, Alex Dennison, doesn't believe that she would take her own life. And so, on the



first anniversary of Monica's death, he invites the people he suspects could have killed Monica to read the new play in hopes of catching the murderer.

This play is a thrilling theatrical mystery by the creators of *Columbo* and *Murder She Wrote*, Richard Levinson & William Link. It was adapted by D.D. Brooke from the teleplay. *Rehearsal for Murder* is being produced by the Broomfield Community Players (BCP) and directed by Max Cabot. Everyone involved with BCP productions are volunteers and all proceeds benefit the continuation of this community theater program.

Veterans Museum's Coffee & Conversations

New Exhibit: Celebrating the Museum Founders

The six men who founded the Broomfield Veterans Museum 20 years ago are being celebrated in a new exhibit at the museum. World War II veterans Vic Boccard, Paul Murphy, John Atkinson, Bob Davenport, and Bob Seeber (along with Bill Humphrey) were the driving force behind the establishment of the Museum. The exhibit, which also pays tribute to Broomfield's original Mamie Doud Eisenhower Library location in the building, will be up until early April. The exhibit will be replaced with an exhibit commemorating the 80th anniversary of the Doolittle Raid on Tokyo in which two Coloradans took part.

March 12 | Bill Bates joined the U.S. Army in 1967 and received Primary Helicopter training at Fort Wolters, Texas, followed by Advanced Flight

training at Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia. Upon completion, Bill was commissioned as a Warrant Officer. He arrived in Vietnam in the spring of 1968 and was assigned to the 7/17 AirCav. This unit supported the 4th Infantry Division at Camp Enari, near Pleiku in the Central Highlands. Bill flew "B" model gunships for about a month before volunteering for the Scout platoon. Scouts provided recon intelligence on path usage, estimated troop size, and bunker and camp usage, as well as close air support. Bill averaged 120-140 combat hours a month and was shot down three times by enemy fire.

March 19 | Tim Hutchinson is the Broomfield Veterans Service Officer will provide a quarterly update to the VA claims process, the new appeals program, and changes resulting from Covid-19. Tim is a Navy veteran having served aboard the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Midway, attached to the US Navy 7th Fleet, from July 1984 to April 1988.

March 26 | Bob Grow served in the U.S. Air Force for 22 years in multiple challenging assignments. He graduated in 1967, the ninth class of the newly formed U.S. Air Force Academy. He subsequently trained as navigator and bombardier and flew for 10 years on F4E Phantom jets in Laos, England, Eglin AFB and Spain. During 1970-71 he served as a "Tiger FAC," one of the forward air controllers who flew fastmoving F-4E Phantoms over the deadly skies of Laos and North Vietnam.

April 9 | Flint Whitlock will give a special presentation titled, "The Liberation of the Buchenwald Concentration Camp." Flint, a BVM board member and member of the Colorado Authors Hall of Fame, spent many years and visits to the site of the camp that is today a memorial to Hitler's victims doing deep research, uncovering chilling photos, and interviewing survivors and liberators. This research formed the basis to create his award-winning, "The Buchenwald Trilogy," that is the most comprehensive history of this place of evil and the regime behind it.

April 23 | Robert MacDonald entered the Army in 1959 and retired 30 years later as a Colonel. He served in the Infantry, Special Forces Green Beret, and Military Police. During the Vietnam war he was an advisor within the South Vietnam Army and on his second tour he was designated to serve as a US representative for repatriation of enemy prisoners of war after the war completed. He was also involved in the return of US prisoners held in prison in Hanoi, North Vietnam. He had a number of command and staff assignments after the war to include staff officer under the Superintendent of the Military Academy at West Point.

May 14 | Battle of Midway – This year will mark the 80th anniversary (4-7 June 1942) of this significant naval battle of WWII in the Pacific Theater, occurring six months after the attack on Pearl harbor and one month after the battle of the Coral Sea. This special talk will address the key events of the battle, and will include a display of period U.S. and Japanese model ships built by master modelers Jerry Gavaldon and Kent Strapko. The Battle of Midway, along with the Guadalcanal campaign, is widely considered a turning point in the Pacific War.

Plans for BCAH Staff-Presented Events

Science+Art Experiences

In 2019, BCAH held its first Moonrise viewing event with over 100 people of all ages in attendance. The purpose of the event was to demonstrate the intersection of science art to convey the message that creativity is at the core of innovation, whether it's engineering a new telescope or creating am artistic masterpiece. This first event featured telescope viewing opportunities, Plein Air painting of the moon by local artists from the Broomfield Art Guild, craft and prize tables, and a live webinar presentation by Janet from "Janet's Planet" from Tennessee and Terry Hancock from the Grand Mesa Observatory in Grand Junction. The event opened the door to new partnerships between BCAH, Tau Zero Foundation, and other partners, like Michael Nothem (astronomer) and CU Fiske Planetarium.

In 2021, BCAH held its second Moonrise Viewing event with over 250 attendees and featured similar activities along with a rocket launch, paper rocket field, and "make your own moon rock" table. The event included the participation of past partners and addition of new partners, such as CSU Extension-Broomfield, Orbital Assembly Corporation, and Standley Lake Stargazing Club.

As a result of the popularity of the events and positive feedback, Science+Art Experiences are officially a new program presented by BCAH with plans to expand the program with one to two additional

We exhibited member artwork at iPie and the Broomfield Community Center in the Spring and Fall. In the Summer, we met for Plein Air painting and pub sketching. Many of us also participated in the North Metro Artists Studio Tour co-sponsored by Paletteers Art Club and Broomfield Art Guild. In the Fall, we started inperson meetings at our new location (see below), presented our beautiful Member Art Show at the College Hill Library in Westminster, and finished the year with a fun Christmas Party catered by iPie Pizza.



For 2022, we continue to meet on the second Tuesday of the month in person at the Presbyterian Church of Broomfield. At our February meeting, Gail Smith demonstrated encaustic painting which is melting and shaping colored wax on paper using a hot iron and stylus. Upcoming meeting demos include preparing for Plein Air, watercolor on yupo paper, and the use of color. In March, April, and May, we have member art on display at the Broomfield Community Center. Currently, we also have an ongoing exhibit at the Broomfield Library near the check-in and research desks.

The Broomfield-Ueda Sister City Exchange (BSC) has been challenged by the global pandemic to meet in person but not our desire to continue to produce thought provoking programming online and to further our relationships with leaders and students of our now over twenty-year program. Junk Goodwin took over as the chair of the organization in 2019 with a committee that supports the programming. Helene Jewett has taken on a government relations role to better inform the City Council and Mayor Castriotta on the successes and growth of the program. BSC is a 100% volunteer, community lead organization with support from Broomfield staff and we operate under the umbrella of Broomfield Council on the Arts & Humanities (BCAH) as a member organization.

Our chair, Junko Goodwin made a trip to Ueda to meet in person with Bill Rettie, Director of the Ueda Broomfield Sister City program as well as members of OPIE-Ueda, the organization that is similar to how BCAH operates with us. Junko was in the country to visit family but took on the extra time and expense to visit with Ueda directly. Her presence was much needed and very well received by Ueda. She did this as a volunteer and covered all her own expenses. OPIE members were so thrilled with her visit that they offered to pay for her bus travel to their location. The discussions included possibility and restrictions for the programming for 2022. Due to Covid cases, there will be no in-person student exchange in 2022.



The following are the events that have been agreed upon for 2022-2024, which are supported by fundraising and promotional events that will be announced.

- There is a High School Student Exchange that will be done virtually on June 17 at 6 p.m. In addition to our Japanese and Broomfield student involvement, this exchange will also include students from China, Taiwan, France, and England. Subjects that the students will be focusing on will include world environment, climate, and human rights issues. It will be a live event that will not be recorded. There will be a practice meeting on April 15. In order to participate in the program, teens must register by April 1 by sending an email to BroomfieldSC@gmail.com. Junko Goodwin will be looking for participants and she will be making a presentation about the High School Student Exchange to the Broomfield Teen Council the week of February 14 and the Library Teen Council the week of February 28.
- The Broomfield Sister City Committee is also making plans to do a virtual exchange event in October. This event will be similar to the September 2021 virtual exchange event that highlighted public art in Broomfield, as well as cultural performances from each city.
- The Broomfield Sister City Committee will focus forward to prepare our delegation for travel to Ueda and surrounding cities in 2023 and the Japanese delegation will arrive in Broomfield in 2024. A great example of the depth of the sister city relationship was evident when the Marshal Fire broke out. The fire broke while Junko was in Japan, and OPIE immediately contacted Broomfield committee personnel to check on our community impact and safety. Junko was presented with \$500 in cash from OPIE representatives when she was there. The Broomfield Sister City committee has decided to donate it to Precious Child. Back in 2019, when Ueda experienced devastating typhoon damage, our committee together with Japan America Society of Colorado conducted an event and donated disaster relief funds to Ueda. This is evidence of the two cities coming together to support our friendship and communities when in need.
