Annamaria took an immediate interest into the compassion, natural healing power, and therapeutic aptitude that the horses demonstrated. She volunteered for over 15 years working with occupational, physical, and speech therapists as they worked with both kids and adults with physical and mental disabilities all while expanding her own horizons and watching her two children thrive in the program.

After spending 25 years in database management and retail, she decided to take the knowledge that she had gained and her love for horses and bet on herself. Believing that horses are at their best when they are sound physically, Annamaria received her certification for equine massage and began building a business that now sees her working on over 125+ horses per month in two different states (Illinois and Wisconsin) and growing.

In addition to her massage work, Annamaria has recently worked with wild mustangs at multiple events nationally in an effort to have them adopted to forever homes. Her work has assisted in having multiple mustangs adopted to work in therapeutic program that work with military veterans.

Her ultimate goal is to be able to help as many horses as she can so that partnerships can be made to the benefit of both the horse and the human being.

John founded and pastored churches in Chicago, El Paso, Texas, and Grand Rapids, Michigan, and served in education K-12 and college, traveling and advocating nationally. Through his career he has worked at the grassroots level addressing pertinent issues affecting urban at-risk communities in the U.S. including the AIDS epidemic at its outset, gang violence, economic, housing and educational inequities, immigration and racial disparities, minority pastoral leadership development, removing barriers to mental health and higher education, and advocating politically in Lansing and Washington D.C. regarding the needs of the most vulnerable.

John grew up second generation Puerto Rican, number 15 of 16 children in the inner city of Chicago, exposed to the impact of community violence and poverty. His experiences have influenced his passion for addressing the impact of complex trauma in youth and adults. Along with his wife Sarah, also an EMDR therapist, he became involved in an equine therapy program volunteering as the development director for the past two years through which he developed an understanding of the powerful impact of horses in the treatment of trauma and mental health. Sarah and John have 4 grown children and one grandchild and also both come from family cultures of military service. They are Army parents of a Blackhawk pilot and Sarah is an adult child of a combat veteran. Throughout their marriage they have rescued and rehabbed a variety of animals and recently adopted two Wild Mustang yearlings and are in the process of starting a non-profit horse sanctuary and trauma-focused equine assisted therapy program for the treatment of both military and civilian populations experiencing the effects of trauma.

This is where he found the connection with Gateway Family Services and met his first horse friend, Gabe. He couldn't get enough of it. Tim returned to the farm in the spring of 2022 as the Veteran Outreach Coordinator. Since then he has learned and trained to understand the equine world as directed by the Gateway team of mental health and equine professionals. He has attended and graduated from the Natural Lifemanship Fundamentals Program. He recently completed the Phase I portion of the Mustang gentling course facilitated by Mustanger Sky Epperson.

Tim is a proud handler of his certified PTSD dog "Scotty." Scotty was paid for, trained by, and gifted to Tim by K9 Mission Warriors of Georgetown, IL American Legion Post.

He is a proud Uncle of four nephews. He sits on the board for "That's The Dream Farm" in Glyndon, MN. He is the Illinois Liaison for registered non for profit "Project Reboot". He is currently working with Vermilion County Probation and their specialty court program where he will likely become a Peer Mentor to their Veteran specific court supervision program. 



Instead of being relegated to pens or smaller pastures where they might have an occasional opportunity to run one or two hundred yards - or possibly even a few thousand feet... the wild horses living at the Refuge continue to run until they choose to stop.

It is truly a beautiful sight to see when these wild horses are able to regain control of where they go and what they do completely on their own!

The Wild Horse Refuge is a completely new facility that was acquired in order to create a special home for Colorado's native Wild Horses.

Wild horses (Mustangs) are allowed to roam freely within the Refuge - which has more than 22,500 acres of land for the horses to roam freely.

In July 2023, Sky Epperson and Annamaria Sims combined Sky's Brain-Based Horsemanship training and Annamaria's Neuro-Pathway Body Work to help 3 untouched Mustangs. We filmed over 6 days of work at the Mustang Adoption Academy and now would like to bring this story to the world. Meet Ambiante MAA and her 5-month foal, Amore MAA, both adopted by Patricia Cross and transported into Indiana for the project. Meet Ajax MAA and Atlas MAA, both found at a nearby long-term holding facility. Follow their stories over the 6 days to see just how well the brain and body collaboration worked for these Mustangs and can work for your horse as well! From first touches to halters, feel good healing to licking and chewing, holding tags on to tags off, see for yourself how this work is making a difference. Now we need your help. The Production phase is expensive. Postproduction is even more so.
