Summer Camp 2020

Week One starts on Sunday, June 21st and ends on June 28th Week Two begins on Sunday, June 28th and ends on July 5th

As of now, Summer Camp is still scheduled as planned. Winter has ended and summer camp registration is underway!

There are only 12 weeks or 81 days left until Troop 78 will arrive at the Dan Beard Campsite at Camp Horseshoe. <u>Summer Camp info on the Troop website</u>.



Due to COVID-19 and given that all BSA and Troop activities are cancelled through April, Council has announced an extension of the discounted rate Final Payment due date

by 30 days. Therefore, registration and the final discounted payment due date for Summer Camp is being extended from March 27, 2020 to May 1, 2020.

The cost this year is \$420.00 per week if paid in full by May 1st (\$475 per week if paid after May 1st). Please include final payment slip with payment. (Final Payment Form is available on the Troop website).

Do not forget about the Multi-Scout Family Discount. Families with more than one scout attending camp with the troop pays the entire fee for Scout one; the entire fee less \$50/week for each additional scout per week.

Health/Medical forms are due May 15th. The health/medical form is on the troop website, Section C must be signed by a physician and must be less than one calendar year old for the entire time you are at camp.

<u>The BSA has updated the Health/Medical Form this year, so make sure to download the</u> <u>most recent form from the Troop 78 website or from the Camp Horseshoe website.</u> Please make sure the completed health/medical form includes parts A, B & C with a front and back copy of your medical insurance card.

If your scout has special dietary needs or needs to take medication while at camp, a Special Dietary Form and Medication Form are also required to be submitted with the health/medical form by May 15th (forms are available on the Troop website).

You will receive a free troop T-shirt if you pay in full by May 1st and turn in your completed medical form to the troop by May 15th.

Troop 78 Scouts learn many skills for rank advancement, hundreds of merit badges, and display their teamwork, skills, and Scout spirit in the many games and contests at camp. The basis for our Scouting program is camping, and this two-week period is always the highlight of our Scouting year.

Your troop committee and leadership would like to have 100% of the troop in camp this summer. We are encouraging 2nd year and up campers to stay for two weeks.

Reminder: All KISC attendees under 18 must attend at least one-week of summer camp.
