

New Hampshire Began Here in 1623 at Odiorne Point, Rye

Join Us to

Landmark Anniversary


Three members of the RHS board met with RHS member and non profit consultant Janet Davis, who has volunteered to initiate an organized effort to recognize the first permanent European settlement in New Hampshire in 1623. So far the RHS Board has: developed a list of public programs that span the full range of Odiorne history, initiated talks with the Seacoast Science Center on collaboration of activities and events, discussed with the Rye Heritage Commission its role in the events, begun discussions with the Native American community to honor the original inhabitants of Odiorne Point, talked about the need for writing and integrating Odiorne/Rye/regional history curriculum units for local schools, discussed seeking collaboration with area towns such as "Portsmouth400," planned to begin regular "Odiorne 2023" news starting with our January 2018 newsletter and explored what lasting legacy this event will have for Rye.

RHS is seeking current and former Rye residents of all generations who would like to join our efforts and participate on a specific aspect of this anniversary which will begin in 2018. Committees will be formed to plan activities and programs of this multi-year event which will reflect our rich history. Beyond individuals who volunteer, we hope to engage as many organized groups in town as possible including those in education, arts, athletics, civic groups, naturalists, military service, maritime connections and local business, just to name a few.

This event has the potential to raise permanent community interest in history in a way we have not seen before, including a revival of the full July 4th celebration of our town as we used to do in years past.
