Kosher Honey-Lemon Olive Oil Cake



eggs

- 1 1/2 cups plain yogurt (not low-fat)
- 2/3 cup olive oil
- 1 cup honey
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 tablespoon (generous) grated lemon zest
- 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 2 1/2 cups (12 1/2 oz.) flour
- 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- pinch ground nutmeg

Pre-heat oven to 350. Grease a 9" springform pan and line the bottom with parchment paper (Update: one of my readers wrote in to tell me that she made this recipe in muffin tins and they came out great! She got 22 muffins from the batch and baked them for 25 minutes. Thank you Randa!).

In a large bowl whisk eggs lightly. Add yogurt, olive oil, honey, vanilla, lemon zest and juice, whisking till combined. Add remaining ingredients and whisk till just smooth and no lumps remain – do not over whisk.

Pour the batter into the cake pan and bake for 60-70 minutes, until a tester comes out clean (cover with foil if the top is getting too

PURIM (LOTS)

The jolly festival of Purim is celebrated every year on the 14-15 of Adar (late winter/early spring). This conforms to 10-11 March on our civil calendar. It commemorates the salvation of the Jewish people in ancient Persia from Haman's plot "to kill and destroy every Jew, young and old, infants, women, in a single day", as recorded in the book of Esther.

The Persian Empire of the 4th century BCE extended over 127 lands, and all Jews there-in were its subjects. When King Ahasuerus (Xerxes) had his wife, Queen Vahti, executed for failing to ask permission to see him, he arranged a beauty pageant to find a new queen. Esther (HADDASAH in Hebrew) a Jewish girl, found favor in his eyes and she became the new queen, though she refused to divulge her nationality.

Meanwhile, a Jew hater called Haman was appointed vizier of the empire. Mordechai, the leader of the Persian Jews and Esther's cousin, defied the king's orders. He refused to bow to Haman which incensed him. Haman convinced the king to issue a decree that ordered the extermination of all Jews on the 13th of Adar. This date was chosen by a lottery held by Haman. It is observed as the Fast of Esther and the Megilah of Esther is read in the synagogue.

Days before the 13th of Adar Mordechai galvanized all the Jews and convinced them to fast, pray and repent to G-d. Meanwhile, Esther asked the King and Haman to join her for a feast. Esther had subsequently revealed to the king her Jewish faith.

In summary: Haman and his sons were hanged on the same scaffold he built for the Jews; Mordechai was appointed vizier (prime minister); and a new decree was issued that granted the Jews the right to defend themselves against their enemies. With this decree's insurance, the Jews mobilized and killed many of their enemies on the 13th of Adar. On the 14th of Adar they rested and celebrated on the 15th known as Shushan Purim they finished the job in the capital city of SHUSHAN and other ancient walled cities such as Jerusalem and Jaffa.

Purim is one day a Jew must get drunk. (Babylonian Talmud Megillah 7B). When a Jew doesn't know the difference between blessed Mordechai and cursed Haman." (IBID). The lesson taught here is to be joyful of freedom yet on guard against anti-Semitism. In every generation we see this in later day Jew haters like Hitler and Stalin.
