Legislative Update: Representative State

Common sense solutions to protect our citizens

When I ran for office in 2020, I talked about trying to deliver for families, and especially seniors, by addressing the challenges in our western Lake County community with commonsense solutions. Now, as a member of the Ohio House of Representatives, I've put forward several bills that, if enacted, would improve the safety and financial security of the seniors that I represent.

One particular issue that I've prioritized relates to home affordability. As Ohio's aging population continues growing, many seniors, especially those on fixed incomes, are severely burdened by increasing property taxes. Often, these households

limits and forced to cut spending on basic necessities, including healthcare, transportation, and quality food. The unfortunate reality is that we have too many seniors spending too much money to cover housing costs, and it's negatively impacting their quality of life. That's why I sponsored HB 207, which reduces the property tax burden on Ohio's fixed-income seniors by expanding the eligibility for homestead exemption programs and increasing the taxable value exemption. This legislation will help seniors stay in their homes and keep some extra money in their pockets. As we move forward, I will continue looking at additional ways to reform and improve our local property tax system.

problem I am Another addressing is the increasing prevalence of abuse, neglect, and exploitation of vulnerable senior citizens. Having served on a Lake County committee tasked with researching and raising awareness regarding elder justice issues, I was eager to tackle this matter at the state level. Though Ohio has laws on the books criminalizing elder abuse, a loophole within the state's mandatory reporting statutes prevents individuals who knowingly fail to report elder abuse from being held accountable. To protect seniors and ensure those who break the law are punished, I have worked in a bipartisan manner with my Republican cosponsor, Representative Bill Seitz, to introduce HB 419. Our legislation eliminates confusion, strengthens penalties, and sends a clear message that Ohio will not tolerate elder abuse. Also, as a member of the Families, Aging, and Human Services Committee,

I co-sponsored and helped pass SB 58, also knowns as "Esther's which will assist in preventing nursing home abuse allowing video cameras in long-term care facilities. I was recently honored to be recognized as Legislator of the Year by the Ohio Association of Area Agencies in Aging at their annual state-wide meeting for my work on elder justice issues and increased senior community services funding.

In addition to senior issues, I have continuously advocated for common-sense consumer protections. According to a recent report from the Ohio Consumers Council, since 2009, utility ratepayers have been wrongly charged more than \$1.5 billion by corporate utility companies. As both a member of the Public Utilities Committee and a firm believer in looking out for the interests of ordinary people, I found this unacceptable. My bill, HB 260, also co-sponsored in a bipartisan fashion with a Republican colleague, mandates refunds to improperly charged consumers and prevents big utility companies from ripping off ratepayers to further enrich wealthy shareholders

campaign donors.

Serving as your Representative for Ohio's 60th House District is truly an honor and a privilege. While many of my colleagues across the political spectrum engage in way too much divisive behavior and rhetoric, I remain committed building consensus and compromise around policies that improve the lives of everyday people. Question: What is your credit score and why do the lenders make such a big deal about it? How will it affect me in these times?

Answer: Back in the 1950's a company called the Fair Isaac Corp. (FICO) developed a formula which was marketed as a way for lenders to realistically evaluate their risk with regard to lending to a specific person. FICO assigned mathematical quantities to patterns of behavior (like how often one pays late, whether they have unsatisfied legal judgments, etc.) and computes those quantities into a numerical risk factor which is known as our "credit rating." FICO sells people's credit ratings to lenders based on their FICO formula which is a trade secret and

There are other companies like FICO which have come up with their own secret form of credit rating which they also sell to credit reporting agencies such as Equifax, Transunion and TRW. In my mind, these companies secrecy causes me to question their integrity and the efficacy of their formulas. FICO should willingly disclose the science behind their mathematical formula so it can be challenged and discussed. It only seems fair that a rating factor which affects so many people's lives, whether it be for getting credit, a job, security clearance or the trust of another person, should be open to investigation. How do we really know its not complete voodoo?

There is a widely held belief that FICO and the entire individual

credit rating system was developed by the elite to keep the average person in their place. "Their place" is presumably in a constant state of fear over their financial rating willing to pay the banks any interest rate or penalty without question.



endorsed television ads for Medicare Advantage plans that say they will pay you \$140 to \$148 a month. Can this be real?

While the plans these celebrities are promoting are perfectly legitimate, they may not deliver everything these pitchmen appear to promise. The commercials do not tell the full story.

Let's begin with some facts. To enroll in one of these plans, you must:

- Be a Medicare beneficiary enrolled in Part A and Part B,
- Be responsible for paying the Part B premium,
- Live in a service area of a plan that has chosen to participate in this program, and
- Find a plan that offers this 'give-back' benefit

While this type of plan is widely promoted, it is not

specifics of each plan will vary. Unfortunately, if you live in an area that does not provide one of these plans, there is no way for you to take advantage of this benefit.

Not everyone gets the full \$148 reimbursement back. The plan determines the amount of the reduction which can range anywhere from \$25 on up. The 'giveback benefit' is not a direct payment to the insured. It is a reduction in their Part B premiums.



Laketran Now Offers Pass Sales at Local Retail Stores with EZfare

Laketran riders can now purchase bus passes at over 70 retail stores throughout the county by adding cash to their EZfare account, the agency's mobile fare payment app.

This new payment option provides a convenient way for riders who have the app, but want or need to pay their bus fare using cash.

"Technology improvement should be inclusive, not exclusive," shared Laketran CEO Ben Capelle. "It is vital to realize that not everyone has access to a credit or debit card, and that

those who still prefer to use cash are not left behind by the advent of digital services. By offering cash digitization, we are enabling all riders to be able to access and enjoy the advantages of mobile ticketing."

Participating retail outlets include many major national chains including Family Dollar, Dollar General, CVS Pharmacy, 7 Eleven, Speedway, Sheetz, Walgreens and Walmart. Riders can visit any retail outlet to preload cash onto their EZfare app. Retailers add credit by accepting a cash payment and

then scanning a barcode in the to grow. EZfare continues to user's app. The rider can then use the deposited cash to buy and store bus passes in their in-app wallet.

The agency launched their EZfare app in 2019 to provide a cashless option to purchase your fare at the bus stop for people who prefer not to carry cash, but learned customers who rely on paying with cash were interested in the app for its convenience.

Laketran collects a quarter of their Local Route and Park-n-Ride fares are through the app and hopes that number will continue

reduce the burden and costs of the transit system's existing ticketing infrastructure and fare boxes.

This is another step towards reducing our cost to collect bus fares," explained Laketran CEO Ben Capelle. "Fare boxes require that we manage cash collection and print physical tickets. They also require a lot of maintenance and are expensive to replace. By allowing riders to add cash to the mobile app and then store it for later use, we reduce cash handling and printing costs."

Laketran removed fare boxes

from its 93 vehicle Dial-a-Ride fleet in 2020 and transitioned Dial-a-Ride to a prepaid service to avoid an over \$1.3 million replacement cost. By removing the fare boxes, Laketran was also able to begin using smaller vans to provide the door-to-door service.

In addition to the cost savings and customer benefits, EZfare also allows for contactless fare collection, which has improved the safety of transit during the pandemic eliminating the need to touch the fare box and allow for social distancing.
