# REFLECTIONS



#### UNCLOGGING OUR DRAINS WITH HOPE

**⊥**sn't it frustrating when we notice our kitchen sink is beginning to drain out slower and slower? We immediately try to unclog it with every tool and chemical available at our disposal. And what a relief when it is finally working properly!

Similarly, there are times when we feel that our lives are clogged with disappointments, troubles, anxieties, worries and more. Sometimes there is much more disappointment in our hearts than hope. According to the prophet, Isaiah, hope is hidden deep within us, safe and secure, and is ready to burst forth in renewed life. Our first reading tells us that all the Israelites desperately needed to hear was a word of hope represented by the green shoot growing out of dry-looking stomp.

Isaiah was an old man when he started searching for a sign of the coming Messiah. He probably felt that there was no hope when he prophesied about the stomp of Jesse. As the years of waiting grew longer, giving up may have crossed his mind several times. But he continued to watch and wait, proclaiming even more eloquently than any other prophet, the Messianic hope. Isaiah's gate of hope must have been completely opened, because he never stopped speaking of the coming hope for the Israelites. He never gave up!

We mustn't give up hope either. This is the time for us to shout. "Don't give up hope yet!" Let us also count on the fact that God's promise of salvation can flood our hearts and spirits and open up our gates of hope. That Holy and divine hope, who is Jesus, comes as a gift from God. Like Isaiah, we may not ever see that kind of hope fulfilled in our life time. Both Isaiah and John the Baptist, were the most credible and expressive prophets of Advent's hope, however, neither of them would see their prophesies fulfilled. But we have been given the opportunity to tell others to remain hopeful. The stomp of Jesse was described as a dead and rotting, dry and barren tree stomp. However, it began to show a hint of vibrancy and new leaves came forth from it.

You may feel hopelessness and helplessness but let us proclaim to one another to "hold on"... the roots underground are still Alive! Let us rejoice, sing and proclaim from the depths of our spirits, the faith and hope that the world needs to hear. What Paul wrote to the people of Rome in the second reading, he is writing to us now, the people of St. Joseph Catholic Church in Maysville..... "Whatever was written previously was written for our instruction, that by endurance and by the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope". Our brother, John the Baptist, says, "Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is at hand!" John's primary mission was to prepare a way for our Lord Jesus Christ. Let us prepare our hearts for His 2nd coming by pouring a steady amount of hopeful God's Word into our clogged drains.

#### SIGNIFICANCE OF ADVENT CANDLES

One of the important practices of the Church during this Advent season is the lighting of four candles. The colors of these candles are three purple and one pink. They mostly signify the color of the season of Advent. The first candle is called the prophet's candle. It reminds us of our hope in the coming of Jesus. The second is the Bethlehem candle, symbolizing our preparation for the revelation of the expected Messiah. The Shepherd candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent. It reminds us of the joy that filled the heart of the shepherds on hearing the good news of the birth of the baby Jesus. It continues to invite us to patiently, in sober reflection, look forward to the joy which comes with our celebration of the commemoration of the birth of the baby Jesus at Christmas. The fourth is the Angel's candle, a symbol of love. It reminds us of the love of God for His creation. For it is written, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him" (John 3:16-17).

There is a fifth candle, the white candle often placed at the center of the Advent wreath. This candle, which we light at Christmas, echoes the presence of Christ, the true Light, among us and in the world.

#### NEW LAW PROVIDES SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CHILDREN AND TAX CREDITS FOR SUPPORTERS:

What if there was a way to donate to a scholarship fund for at-risk children, at absolutely no cost? Now there is for Alabama taxpayers. Through a simple process made possible by the landmark passage of the Alabama Accountability Act of 2013, individuals and corporations can receive dollar for dollar tax credits for contributions to approved Scholarship Granting Organizations, effectively directing their tax dollars to fund scholarships for low income K-12 students who want to transfer out of failing public schools in Alabama. Through this program the financial barriers of tuition can be lowered or erased, allowing these families the freedom to choose the education that they feel works best for their children.
