Why Possibilities Instead of Solutions?

- You want to make a larger sustained impact
- You think it's important to be connected to your community
- There are several related problems
- The problem is repetitive

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Possibilities: The Insects and Weeds are Winning!

Ways to grow into the possibilities...

- Chicken or goat tractors
- Have an intentional bed for weeds or offer an edible weeds class.
- Chip Drop/local tree trimmers/free mulch from the city
- Partner with schools that want to do a hands-on insect IPM lesson
- Offer the tastiest insects free to neighbors with chickens or reptiles or to a local chef if they'll come collect
- Partner with Master Gardeners who can help you with control measures.
- Use signage to turn pests and weeds into education
