Please pray for my family as they work through their grief. Be attentive to the grief of those in our CPC family, their life changes and struggles. We are family. We are blessed!



MISSION FOCUS

The mission focus for October is PATH. PATH ND is a private non-profit child and family services agency that began operations

in North Dakota in 1994.

For many years, our congregation has supported PATH's by contributing to their youth who 'graduate' from the foster care system. Through the now called the Chafee Independent Living Program, young adults are provided assistance in the transition from foster care to independent living in the areas of crisis management, education, employment, grocery shopping, housing, life skills, meal preparation, money management, nutrition, personal and home safety, peer socializing, positive parenting, and study skills.

Even with this training, these folks can become overwhelmed as they begin life on their own. That's where we come in. CPC helps provide many of the essential needs for their first home.

You can help by donating the following consumables: toilet paper, Lysol wipes, laundry soap, dish soap, paper towels, toilet cleaner, dryer sheets, and Ziplock bags. Gift cards to grocery stores or gas stations along with personal items like body wash, deodorant, contact solution, etc. can be given. In addition, donations of can openers, pizza cutters, reusable plastic containers, dishes, pots and pans, small vacuum cleaners, hangers, mattress pads and bedding for full or queen-sized beds, and towels would be welcomed.
