# JESUS TOLD US!

<sup>16:21</sup>From that time on, Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised.

<sup>17:22</sup>As they were gathering in Galilee, Jesus said to them, "The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into human hands, <sup>23</sup>and they will kill him, and on the third day he will be raised." And they were greatly distressed.

<sup>20:17</sup>While Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, he took the twelve disciples aside by themselves, and said to them on the way, <sup>18</sup>See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and scribes, and they will condemn him to death; <sup>19</sup>then they will hand him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified; and on the third day he will be raised."

Have you ever been told something, and your response was, "Nahhh, that can't be true!" The first time might just catch you off guard or perhaps, you are in denial of what you heard. What happens when you hear the same thing a second time? You might explore if it is true. Then, you hear the same thing a third time and you begin to accept: "This might be true."

Jesus told us three times each in three gospels, Matthew, Mark, and Luke, that he will be put to death and on the third day be raised from the dead. The disciples then, and us today, may have walked through these same stages of shock when they heard of Jesus predicting his death to them. What? Wait? Is this true? On Good Friday, the realization of these predictions was, in fact, true. Matthew writes in chapter 27 <sup>50</sup>Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last. <sup>51</sup>At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. The earth shook, and the rocks were split. Jesus breathed his last, but God is not finished. And chapter 28: <sup>6</sup>He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. <sup>7</sup>Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead.

This year almost 2000 years after the Resurrection Event that shocked the disciples and still shocks us today: God so loves the world that His son would die, so that we might live! We may need to hear this more than three times for us to believe it. I declare to you today as we did on Easter Morning!

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He is risen!

#### Mother's Day Honorariums and Memorials:



The support team coordinated the removal of the leaves from the Scout Hut in preparation for Sunrise service.


