Caring Lesson Primary

Read and discuss with students:

The dictionary says that *caring* has several meanings. One definition is showing concern for something. Being concerned for something or someone shows that they are important to you.

Caring can be described in two ways. It can be the way you feel <u>or</u> something you do. *Caring* about someone is an important feeling, but showing someone you care is even more important. How would you know if someone was a *caring* person? Would you know by how they feel, the things they say or by their actions?

When *caring* is used as a verb, it expresses action! That action can take many forms. Your actions speak louder than your words. Caring for someone is nice but sometimes we must roll up our sleeves and get busy. Can you think of some things you can do to SHOW that you are a *caring* person?
