Broward nonprofits team up to tackle shoreline restoration with Project ROC

Youth Environmental Alliance, HandsOn Broward to educate youth about environmental stewardship

Three Broward-area nonprofits are teaming up to tackle the issue of critically-eroded shorelines by educating and activating 1,000 youth and adults in habitat protection education and restoration. Youth Environmental Alliance (YEA) and HandsOn Broward (HOB), with partner South Florida Audubon Society (SFAS), will host **eight beach restoration events in 2017-18**.

Journalists and members of the press are invited to attend these restoration projects, shoot photo and video, and interview volunteers and project participants. Complete details about the project are outlined below.

Who:

Youth Environmental Alliance (YEA) and HandsOn Broward (HOB), with additional partner, South Florida Audubon Society (SFAS).

What:

Youth Environmental Alliance, in collaboration with HandsOn Broward and the South Florida Audubon Society, has received a grant of \$61,000 from the Community Foundation of Broward to continue Project ROC!, a community-based coastal reclamation and education program.

Where

Project ROC events will take place:

October 24, 2017 November 18, 2017 December 9, 2017 January 28, 2018 February 24, 2018 March 17, 2018 May 21, 2018

Volunteers will *remove exotic plants* or *replant sea oats and other native plants* along the Broward County coastline as vital part of the solution to restore the dune ecosystem which provides a variety of economic and direct benefits to all residents of Broward County as well as wildlife.

Details:

Through Project ROC!, Youth Environmental Alliance and HandsOn Broward will tackle the issue of critically-eroded shorelines by educating and activating 1,000 youth and adults in environmental stewardship and habitat protection. Participants will help reverse coastal habitat loss and improve coastal resiliency at eight Broward County sites by cleaning up beaches, removing invasive plants, and installing native plants that discourage beach erosion while providing habitat for sea turtle nesting, food for pollinators, and way-stations for migratory birds. Participants also will have the opportunity to train as Project Leaders who will mobilize volunteers at each site.

This dynamic partnership combines Youth Environmental Alliance's extensive education and coastal restoration knowledge and experience with HandsOn Broward's proven volunteer mobilization and leadership training. To round out this collaboration, HandsOn Broward and Youth Environmental Alliance also have partnered with the South Florida Audubon Society. The South Florida Audubon Society will advocate for the project to help facilitate restoration implementation in local municipalities and at coastal properties through informative talks about project ROC and the importance of dunes as they impact Sea Turtles.
