IMPOTANT INFORMATION WHY WE ARE INCREASING OUR INCOME

It takes an enormous amount of time, and a lot of money to run this club. Trail Dusters is, in many ways, like a business. Of course, we all participate in our own way to make this happen. For example, we all pay our annual dues to help in the clubs financial needs. But, the dues do not cover all the expenses required to run the club.

Costs continue to increase across the board every year. Yet we continue to operate on the same income we've generated for decades, with no consideration toward keeping up with inflation and rising costs. After all the income we raised from all sources, and, after all our expenses were paid, we lost \$2,000.00.

For this reason the Trail Dusters Board has unanimously approved the following action. Starting in October, Club dues will be increased from \$25.00 person to \$35.00 per per person. Starting on January 8, 2020 there will be a \$2.00 donation, to be paid at the door, for all Trail Dusters, at every Wednesday night class.

To put this in perspective, this amounts to a total cost of \$3.03 per person, per week for 34 weeks. Where can you get everything our club offers for \$3.03? NOWHERE!

We all love our club, and we want it to continue to grow and be financially healthy. The actions we are taking will allow us to enjoy everything that the Trail Dusters offers all of us for many more years to come.

<u>IMPORTANT INFORMATION!!</u> ALL TRAIL DUSTERS <u>PLEASE</u> READ THIS LETTER WHICH EXPLAINS THE REASON THAT THE BOARD VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TO MAKE NEEDED CHANGES TO INCREASE OUR CLUB'S INCOME:

The Trail Dusters Square Dance Club. What does this club mean to us? I think it means a lot of different things.

First, it is a dance club. We're so fortunate to have the opportunity to learn how to square dance. Second, it's a place where we meet dozens of new friends, many of whom will be life long friends. Third, it's a club that provides wonderful social events, such as club dinners together, the Hoedown, New Year's Eve, the theater fund raiser, the May weekend, and class graduation, just to name a few. Also, don't forget that many of us participate in social events outside the club, such as mahjong, poker, mystery groups, movie nights, and book clubs. Without our club we would not have any of this. I would wager that many of us would agree that belonging to Trail Dusters has been life changing. It has been for Joni and me.

But, we also have to remember that Trail Dusters is also like a business. It takes a lot of money, as well as time and effort, to run the club and offer all the events and activities mentioned above. You may say, "We pay dues each year to pay for the club's financial needs." And, you would be correct. Except, our individual dues do not cover the total cost of running the club.

Please, stop reading further for a moment. Think to yourself what you imagine it costs our club to put on a Wednesday night square dance class at Bay Laurel Elementary School. Come up with a guess.

Ok, let's look at the cost of a Wednesday night class. Let's examine the 2018-2019 class year that just ended. After you take all the money contributed by the Rail Dusters at the door each week, plus the money contributed to the brandy glass, and then, subtract the rent we pay to Bay Laurel Elementary School, Paul Waters' salary, and kitchen costs attributed to the refreshments each week, it still costs an additional **\$259.00** every Wednesday night over and above what we take in.

Costs continue to increase across the board year after year. We always have unexpected loss of income from events beyond our control. We have continued to operate on the same income we've generated for many years, with no consideration toward keeping up with inflation and rising costs. In fact, it seems that nobody can accurately remember when we last increased the club dues. Even members who have been with the club 10, 15 or 20 years can't remember the last increase in dues. Who among us could maintain their life style on the same income they earned 20 years ago? Nobody!

(Continued) IMPORTANT INFORMATION!! ALL TRAIL DUSTERS PLEASE READ THIS LETTER WHICH EXPLAINS THE REASON THAT THE BOARD VOTED UNANIMOUSLY TO MAKE NEEDED CHANGES TO INCREASE OUR CLUB'S INCOME:

In fact <u>the Total Club Income</u> for the year, collected from dues, the money we collect from the Rail Dusters, brandy glass contributions, and money raised through fundraisers (New Years, Simi Theater, Restaurants, May Weekend, etc.), all goes to cover the cost of our

Wednesday night classes. This means that last year, the club was left without enough income to cover the Saturday Club dance losses, advertising, insurance, office supplies, dues, etc. Our loss for the 2018-2019 year was just short of \$2,000.00.

For this coming dance year, 2019-2020 our expenses are going to continue to rise. The combined planned increase in next year's rent for Bay Laurel Elementary and Wilkinson Senior Center alone will add another \$1,000.00 a year to our overhead. And these are just the costs increases we know about.

So, the Trail Dusters Board has unanimously approved the following action. Club dues will be increased from \$25.00 per person to \$35.00 per person. Starting on January 8, 2020 there will be a **\$2.00 donation**, to be paid at the door, for all Trail Dusters, at every Wednesday night class.

To put this in perspective, if an individual Trail Duster pays their dues, and attends every Wednesday night class for 34 weeks, the cost to that Trail Duster will amount to only

\$3.03 a week! You can't even buy a cup of coffee for this amount. Where can you get everything we talked about above for \$3.03? **NOWHERE!**

We are not the only club going through this. All the other clubs are experiencing the same things we are. Some may not survive. But we are going to survive and prosper. We all love this club, and we want it to continue to grow and be healthy. It is imperative that we initiate this action to ensure the long term health of Trail Dusters. In this way we will be able to enjoy everything that Trail Dusters offers all of us for many more years to come.
