

6.08 By-Laws Committee - The By-laws committee shall consist of a minimum of three (3) members and shall be responsible for receiving, reviewing, investigating and assessing requests from members in good standing to alter, amend, repeal, or add new by-laws. All by-law changes must be received by the committee a minimum of 90 days before a regular or special membership meeting. The committee will review all by-laws requests and give a written opinion to the membership as to the effective change to the Association. All by-law requests will be assessed by the committee and presented to the membership.

Revised

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In the event of exigent circumstances; including but not limited to, changes in legal precedent which effects a current by-law, Association changes in procedure or policy which effects a current by-law, etc; an Association by-law(s) may be amended on a temporary basis by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Association members will be notified by US Postal Service no later than ten (10) days after the temporary by-law change(s) goes into effect. The notification will explain the change(s) to the by-law(s), specify the reason for the change(s), and why the change(s) needed to be expedited. The temporary by-law change(s) will be added to the next Membership Meeting agenda for membership approval. The By-Law Committee will be responsible for revising the effected by-law(s) prior to presentation to the full membership.
