

Wayne Davis Sunset Village

Resident Spotlight

Wayne was born in Quincy, Illinois on May 14, 1940, to Oliver Pearl and Dorothy Davis. He lived near Palmyra, MO. His family then moved near Cherry Box, which is west of Leonard, MO. Wayne came from a hard working farm family. He had five brothers and one sister. Times were tough and during his high school days. Wayne

went to work for a local family to help support his family. He went to Leonard High School and later met his wife, Roberta Ann Carpenter, during his junior-senior years of high school. Wayne and his wife both graduated in May of 1959. They were married on November 21, of that year.. They have four chil-

dren: Steven Wayne, Belinda Marie, Yvonne Annette and Robert Wayne. They have several grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Wayne joined the Air Force as an Air Craft Mechanic in January 1960. He attended 8 weeks of basic training at Lackland Air Force Base near San Antonio, TX. He then attended

Air Craft Mechanic's school at Sheppard AFB in Wichita Falls. TX. He was stationed at Richard Gerbaur Air Force Base near Belton, MO from June 1960 to November 1965. His next duty station was RAF Wethersfield near Essex, England for three years. He was then stationed at Shaw Air Force Base near Sumter, SC. His family stayed there at Sumter while Wayne did a year in Vietnam (November 1970-November 1971). In 1972, Wayne cross trained to become a Flight Engineer on the C130 at Little Rock AFB in Arkansas because he loved to fly. He was transferred to Dyess AFB near Abilene, TX. He visited several bases in Europe during his time as Flight Engineer. He was often TDY and away from his family. Up until 1975, Roberta was a stay at home mom. She later started working to help purchase their retirement/dream farm north of Bevier, MO. After 20 years in the Air Force, Wayne retired on January 31, 1980. During his military career, he received many metals for his distinguished career.

On July 3, 1980, they arrived at their 40 acre farm. They have been there for 38 years. In those years, Wayne helped farmers and then drove a truck for Poole Trucking. On September 20, 1989, Wayne suffered a grand maul stroke which left him with no use of his right arm, a weak right leg and speech jargon. However, he was still able to understand you. He improved to walk with a can and could drive with a left foot pedal. He was determined to use his left hand to bowl and swing a hand ax. With his Kawasaki Mule, he was able to go to



the back field and clear brush with his dog. In 1980, Roberta started working for Loch Haven Nursing Home. In March 1990, Wayne suffered a severe seizure and could not be left alone per

the VA doctor. Roberta's work allowed Wayne to come walk the halls for several months until his local doctor cleared him to stay home. In June 2004, he had another stroke which left him in a wheelchair. Thinking he would not be able to bowl any more, the alley allowed him to bowl from his wheelchair, which thrilled him. He also continued to enjoy going out to

eat several times a week.

He came to live at Loch Haven in February 2017, due to a broken heel. Unfortunately, he never recovered enough to return to his dream home. Roberta visits him twice a day.

2 cups blackberries

1/4 cup additional sugar

Whisk together sugar, flour, and milk. Add melted butter and whisk

together. Pour batter into a well buttered baking dish. Add the blackberries and sprinkle the 1/4 cup sugar on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

12 dinner rolls (sliced in half)

12 slices ham

12 slices swiss cheese

1 T butter (melted)

1/4 c. brown sugar

2 T Worcestershire sauce

1 t. onion powder



- 1. Mix together all ingredients for the sauce.
- 2. Assemble the sandwiches with the ham & cheese inside the sliced rolls.
- 3. Brush the tops of the sandwiches with the sauce, as well as the insides.
- 4. Cover pan & refrigerate 4-24 hours.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees with the foil covering the sandwiches.
- 6. Uncover and bake another 10-15 minutes.

Crispy Potato Wedges

2 T paprika

2 T olive oil

1 T garlic powder

1 T chili powder

1 t salt

1 t pepper

4 large potatoes, cut into

wedges

1 C bread crumbs



Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Mix paprika, olive oil, garlic powder, chili powder, salt and pepper together in a bowl until marinade is smooth. Place potatoes in a baking dish. Add marinade and rub into potatoes. Sprinkle bread crumbs over potatoes and coat each wedge well. Bake in preheated oven for 30 minutes. Reduce heat to 355 degrees and continue cooking until wedges are tender enough to puncture with a fork (about 30 minutes more).
