### *Are you ready for Holy Week?*

Here's an important question: If you were really ready for Holy Week, how would you know? Perhaps this is an equally important question: What does it mean to be "ready for Holy Week"?

I think we should also answer that question about Holy Week in a practical way, yet also in a way that is deeply spiritual, and in a way that will reach beyond Holy Week itself—and, if we do it right, our answer will reach into eternity.

As we ponder our answer to the question of what it means to be "ready for Holy Week," we might consider also that none of us knows if we will live that long, or if Our Blessed Lord will return in glory before April 21, 2019. Jesus counsels alertness.

The "hour" of the Lord came when he was revealed as the Lamb of God on the cross, and his "hour" continued as he was revealed as the vindicated Only-Begotten Son of the Father at his resurrection. Even so, Christ appeared "hidden" to many, because they saw but they did not believe. Even now, it seems that Christ is "hidden"; we wonder why people walk away from him and his Church.

When, he will appear as the "triumphant Lion of Judah" (Revelation 5:5). The best way for us to prepare for Christ's return in glory is to prepare well to live rightly the events and wisdom and graces of Holy Week, made present again through the Sacred Scriptures and through the Sacred Liturgies of the Church.

This Holy Week, we must choose who we will be in the great drama unfolding before us. Shall we be boastful Peter, swearing fidelity but denying the Lord three times? Despairing Judas, who, rather than repenting, dies by his own hand? One of the fickle mob, waving palms on Sunday and screaming for blood on Friday? Shall we be the Beloved Disciple who finally finds his way to the foot of the cross, who takes the sorrowful mother of Jesus into his home?

This Holy Week, the timeless Christ will ask us, in our time, to decide, who he is, and who we are. If he truly is the Son of God

and Son of Mary, truly the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, if he truly is our crucified, risen, reigning and returning king, then we must do so much more this Holy Week than simply "keep watch" with him. We have to identify with him, make his suffering and sorrow our own. Knowing that we are now covered in the ransoming blood of an innocent man, then we must ask for the grace to live this one Holy Week as the week that changed us, for the better, and forever.

### *¿Están listos para la Semana Santa?*

¿Aquí esta una importante pregunta: si realmente están listos para la Semana Santa, como lo sabrían? Tal vez esta es también una pregunta igual de importante: ¿Que significa el estar "listo para la Semana Santa? Pienso que también deberíamos contestar esa pregunta acerca de la Semana Santa de una manera práctica, pero también de una manera hondamente espiritual, y de una manera que llegue más allá de la Semana Santa- y, si lo hacemos de la manera correcta, nuestra respuesta alcanzara hasta la eternidad.

Al pensar en nuestra respuesta sobre la pregunta de lo que significa "estar listo para la Semana Santa," nosotros deberíamos considerar también que nadie de nosotros sabe si llegaremos a vivir hasta entonces, o si Nuestro Santísimo Señor volverá en gloria antes del 21 de abril del 2019. Jesús nos aconseja estar alerta.

La "hora" del Señor llevo cunado él fue revelado como el Cordero de Dios en la cruz, y su "hora" continuó al ser revelado como el vindicador Hijo Único del Padre en su resurrección. Aun así, Cristo aparece "oculto" para muchos, porque ellos vieron pero no creyeron. Aun ahora, parece que Cristo esta "oculto"; y nos preguntamos por qué mucha gente se aleja de Él y de su Iglesia.

Cuando, el aparezca como el "León triunfante de Judá" (Revelación 5:5). La mejor manera de prepararnos para el regreso de Cristo en gloria es prepararse bien para vivir de una buena manera los eventos y la sabiduría y gracias de la Semana Santa, hecha presente nuevamente a través de las Sagrada Escrituras y a través de las Sagradas Liturgias de la Iglesia.

Esta Semana Santa, debemos elegir quienes seremos en el gran drama que se nos presentara ante nosotros. ¿Seremos el vanaglorioso Pedro, jurando fidelidad pero negando al Señor tres veces? ¿O el desesperado Judas, quien, en vez de arrepentirse, muere por sus propias manos? ¿O uno de los de la muchedumbre inconstante, meneando las palmas el domingo y gritando pidiendo la sangre de Jesús el viernes? ¿Podríamos ser el discípulo amado que finalmente encuentra su camino al pie de la cruz, quien lleva a la madre dolorosa de Jesús a su casa? Esta Semana Santa, el eterno Cristo nos pedirá, a nuestro tiempo, que decidamos, quien es el, y quienes somos nosotros. Si Él es realmente el Hijo de Dios y el Hijo de María, realmente el Cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo, si Él es realmente nuestro rey crucificado, resucitado y que volverá como rey reinante, entonces debemos hacer mucho más en esta Semana Santa que simplemente "vigilar" con El. Tenemos que identificarnos con El, hacer de su sufrimiento y dolor hacerlos nuestros. Sabiendo que ahora estamos cubiertos por la sangre de un hombre inocente, debemos pues pedir la gracia de vivir esta Semana Santa como la semana que nos cambie, para lo mejor, y para siempre.
