3.0 January Presentation - Martin AJ6OH presented Raspberry Pi and Ham Radio

Raspberry Pi (RPi) is a series of very small and inexpensive single board computers developed 12 years ago in the United Kingdom to encourage basic computer experimentation and tinkering with computers and software. RPi uses a Linux operating system (Raspberry Pi OS formerly known as Raspbian) and consists of the CPU and interfaces (and some memory). Display, keyboard, mouse, external memory, and power source must be added for functionality. RPi differs from a microcomputer in that it uses 5 volts instead of the 12 volts for microcomputers. KM4ACK has Build-A-Pi which is an extensive package of RPi applications for ham radio available for download. Martin demonstrated RPi use as a means to set up a WinLink mail server over packet radio with amazing capability and little hardware for emergency applications. YouTube has KM4ACK videos to add this low cost capability to your ham shack. Vara capability is coming as 3B, 4 and 5 are current versions. For example, RPi boards and kits are available on Amazon from \$25 to \$200. Circuit board packaging may require heat sink for resilient operation and many ham radio applications are available: WSJT-X, weather satellite images, APRS, ham clock, SDR,, hot spots for DMR, C4FM, D-Star, etc. Martin has extensive experience with this new capability and will be happy to help you get started.

4.0 Announcements
