
37. Jesus is Arrested

Jesus is Arrested

The Jewish leaders hated Jesus. "The whole world has gone after him!" they said. "He must die." They paid Judas to tell where Jesus was. This disciple told them and betrayed Jesus.

- c) What bad thing did Jesus do that got him arrested?


After you read:

A Picture of the Messiah (Part 1 of 2)

More than 700 years before Jesus was born and 2,000 years before cameras were invented, the prophet Isaiah created a picture of Jesus, the Messiah. Give each student a copy of the two charts and use an easy-to-read version of the Bible, perhaps NIrV. Have the boys read a prophecy from Isaiah 52-53 on the left side of both charts. The girls will look up and read the New Testament fulfillment on the right.

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A Picture of the Messiah (Part 2 of 2)

Using both charts and the printed stories, students will match the prophesy on the left to lines in the Easy Read English stories (36, 37, 39, 40, 41). They will color code to match them. For example, in the Part 1 chart, color the line on the left red where it says, "6. He will be arrested." In this story (number 37), color the 11th sentence red that says, "They arrested Jesus." Create a rainbow of belief while students watch the Word of God come to life.

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A Prophetic Portrait

Isaiah 53 was written hundreds of years before Jesus was born. Yet, the details describe Jesus exactly. In fact, we could say it is a perfect portrait of our Savior. Get a flat, wood 5x7 frame. Let the kids go through Isaiah 52:13-15 and Isaiah 53. Find words that describe Jesus and his death and resurrection. Using a bright gel marker, write these phrases and verses right onto the frame, such as: "Like a lamb, he opened not his mouth; He was pierced for our sins," etc. Hold up the empty frame and ask who fits this description. Read fulfilled verses from the chart above. Print and place the portrait of Jesus into it. It will be a perfect fit!
