Bob McGeever

My wife and I have been rail fans all our lives. I got interested in model trains as a kid when my dad gave me and

my brother his childhood Lionel train set. I spent the first 30 years of my married life intending to build a model railroad. My boys and I went to the train show every couple of years and dreamed of what we could do with half the basement. Time passed, the boys grew up and I found I finally had the time to build a model railroad.

I started the planning a layout about 12 years ago. I'm working in N scale using the WSOR as my prototype. It supports my interest in lots of local freights in limited space, it runs through the town I live in, and I really like the color scheme on their locos. I have what I call my second draft up and running. The third draft is in the planning stage and construction will start in the spring. With each draft it gets bigger.

I joined the NMRA in 2010 to learn from other people with more experience. I have had the honor of serving on the BOD since 2011 as the Clerk and the Superintendent.

I really enjoy the monthly SCWD meetings particularly the clinics but even more the wealth of knowledge and friendships of the members who graciously share their skills and knowledge which I sorely needed and will need more in the future.

2016 Spring SCWD Railfan Trip Information – It's A GO!

A SCWD sponsored two day railfan trip has been planned to Rochelle and Galesburg, Illinois for **May 20&21**. The itinerary will be a repeat of the trip SCWD sponsored in April 2011 as follows: leave Madison at 8:00 am on Friday; stop at Rochelle Railroad Park (viewing of UP & BNSF crossing diamond) in am; lunch in Rochelle; Galesburg by 3:00 pm for railfaning at local park; dinner and overnight in

Galesburg; breakfast at motel on Saturday; 9:00 am to noon a tour of BNSF diesel maintenance/repair facility, yard tour, hump tower tour, remote engine demo plus Hwy 10 bridge photo op of the yard; lunch in Galesburg; Galesburg Railroad Museum in afternoon and arrival back in Madison by 6:30 pm. 

The Board of Directors meeting for the 2015-2016 South Central Wisconsin Division. Midwest Region, National Model Railroad Association was called to order at 7:08 p.m. on Feb. 15, 2016 by Superintendent Bob McGeever. In attendance were Board members McGeever, Mike Vivion, John Haverberg, Phil Berry, Phil Hottmann, Bill Clancy, Alan Paine and guests Jerry Lawler and David Lendved. Bob declared a quorum present.

Minutes Approval: A motion was made by Bill Clancy, seconded by Mike Vivion and approved by the Board to accept the minutes of the 1/11/2016 Board Meeting as presented.

Paymaster Report: Phil B. presented the Paymaster report for January 2016. A motion was made by Bill, seconded by Mike and approved by the Board to accept as presented.

Committee Reports:

Bad Order: With the late February date for the BOD meeting, Kathy Clancy needs all reports and articles in as soon as possible.

Clinics: Hands on, steel coil loads for March meeting

Layout Tours: Bob McGeever, Phil Berry for March meeting, Waunakee layouts for April.

Membership: Bob would like to put the SCWD booth at the Rail Show near the Kalmbach booth starting in 2017 to encourage new SCWD memberships.

Picnic: John indicated that he has reserved the large pavilion at Little Amerricka on Saturday, July 23rd, Whiskey River Railway Day as was done the last two years. Caterer has yet to be chosen. Board agreed to have John announce the picnic date and location.

Publicity: John has added Rail Model Hobbyist as a source to list the monthly SCWD meetings.

Rail show: 2016 show is on target for next weekend.

Website: Tom Morrison has taken over administrative duties. Jerry Lawler is interested in helping with web site.

Youth Group: Mike asked if youth group might be interested in HO Trak modules as their "club" layout rather than a dedicated fully fixed HO layout. Bob said that should be investigated.

Old Business:

Details are still tentative until Jim Clayton from the Galesburg Railroad Museum confirms the visit to the BNSF yard and shops will be acceptable to the company. Jim hopes to have the okay by the end of February. Board agreed that John can proceed with exploratory announcement to the Division and provided some limits and restrictions for such a trip.
- 2) Mike, as the nominating committee chairman for the BOD member elections. asked again if any existing members were not going to run again in April for the Board. Three current members said they would not. Mike will continue to solicit for new candidates to run.
