


2017 REALITY CHECK

The politicization of government and media has masked the severity of the problems that our officials must deal with in 2017.

PUBLIC DEBT is about 120% of the GDP and the generally accepted limit is 90% for a developed country.

COST OF GOVERNMENT is roughly 54% of the GDP nationwide and 58% in NYS. Economists generally agree that developed countries are in decline when the ratio exceeds 15-25%.

BLUE STATES (17 or 34%) have 39% of the U.S. population, 15% of above average public education, 35% of crime, 44% of GDP, 47% state/local cost, 48% of homeless veterans, 50% of state/local debt, and 59% of all homeless.



NEW YORK STATE has 6% of the U.S. population, average public education, 4% of crime, 5% of homeless veterans and 16% of the homeless as well as 10% of the state/local cost and 12% of debt.

SCORECARD: State Government Transparency and Accountability

The Center for Public Integrity, winner of a 2014 Pulitzer Prize, investigates transparency and accountability in all 50 state governments. New York had a D rating and was ranked 37th out of 50 in 2012. In 2015, the rating dropped to D- but the rank improved to 31st. So it seems that even though things got worse in NYS, other states
