### Briefs From the Board

### ASqD Who? What? and What's it gonna cost me?

ASqD is an abbreviation for the Associated Square Dancers and Trail Dusters is a member of this organization. Why should you care about ASqD? The bottom line is that the Association provides guidance and recommendations to the sixteen square dance clubs that comprise ASqD. In addition, ASqD provides a forum for square dance clubs to raise questions, introduce new ideas and recommendations that many clubs may want considered. Trail Dusters have an ASqD delegate and it's me, Bill Dickter. I was motivated to become the delegate when I found out that there were some ASqD initiatives and other important stuff that we are missing out on.

ASqD holds General meetings on a quarterly basis and are open to delegates from all ASqD member clubs. There are sixteen member clubs that comprise ASqD and they geographically range from Thousand Oaks to Orange County. General were held at the meetings Hawthorne Memorial Center until Covid-19 hit. Meetings are now held via Zoom and this makes it easier for member clubs to participate.

There are many instances where ASqD efforts provide support for the Trail Dusters and the other clubs. Most notable is ASaD's taking the lead to introduce SSD, Social Square Dancing, to member clubs oversee and support implementation. Another example is where ASqD has taken responsibility for providing insurance for square dance clubs. This includes facilities and club members too. Recent ASqD efforts have identified a new insurance company with a lower cost plus a terrific insurance broker to work with (that would be Paul Waters). Notably ASqD warned member clubs to stop using raffles to raise funds when it found out that club raffles are illegal in California. Old time Trail Dusters remember our weekly 50-50 raffle which we had to give up.

At the club level, Trail Dusters is one of nine clubs that comprise ASqD's Valley District. Each club has a delegate who attends the monthly District meetings (and that includes me). District meetings provide an opportunity to bring clubs together and share ideas about how various challenges and issues are being dealt with. I find these meetings bring up stuff that I find useful and bring them back to our board to consider. In addition, I submit a paragraph or two at each meeting and inform other delegates as to what's going on with Trail Dusters. I also interact with other delegates when they discuss what is happening with their clubs. A recent topic of conversation that is germane to Trail Dusters is what type of class or workshop they are considering for their newest members who have completed the fifteen week course learning the SSD calls. This is an issue that our board is addressing.

Thanks for reading all this stuff. We'll turn the lights out now.




