Page 11 What's New For 2016 When you want to put a band together there are at least 4 important qualities you look for in band mates. Let's consider the following:

- 1. The best musician you can get at the time you start
- 2. The most dedicated and loyal person you can find that respects the music and is willing to rehearse to make the band as good as it can be.
- 3. A person you trust not to embarrass the group on or off the stage (unless you find a John Duffey clone, then you forget the rest of the rules!)
- 4. A person you would want as a friend on or off the stage

Add them all together and you get *THE BUD WALLS FACTOR*.

When 'My Favorite Bluegrass Band' formed some years ago, Tom Murphy, Barry Hartman, and I were trying to find a fiddle, mandolin, or a dobro player to round out the group. Most of the choices we had were not what we wanted. No slight intended, but the criteria above narrowed the field. The three of us would get together and work hard to get vocals and arrangements together but something was always missing.

We knew Bud Walls was working with a group that had been together a long time and he was dedicated to Jamie, Paul, Coy and Phil. We respected that as one of the qualities we were looking for. We took some gigs and asked Bud, if he wasn't busy, would he help us out. Of course he did. When Mark Stidham

joined us on the mandolin, even Bud admitted the group took a definite turn for the better. We were successful enough to do the Festival of Bluegrass in Lexington, KY, a bucket list item fulfilled.

Over the years the MFBGB has become mostly a good time basement or porch pickin' group, but the one factor that all agree on is the "Bud Walls Factor". Bud proved to be the culmination of all 4 conditions essential in any good band mate.

Having Bud in our band, we made some of our best music. He will be missed in so many ways and for so many reasons. I will quote Lynn Hayes (Rick Hayes of Nightflyer's wife) when I informed them of Bud's passing. She said, "OMG, not our Bud!" That summed it up. *OUR BUD*. He was a credit to any circle of friends, musicians, or family and we all claimed him as *OURS*.

Bud used to ask me which of his dobros would be appropriate for our gigs. It made for some real unimportant conversation because if he had one or the other in his hands, and he was on the stage with you, it didn't make any difference. The factors that made Bud the man he was made us proud he was with us. We want to thank "DJ", his loving wife of 48 years, for sharing him with all of us.

From all of us that called you *OUR BUD* God bless you for being a friend, band mate, incredible musician, wonderful family man and inspiration to all.

#### "Bud" Walls

Born Murrel Wesley Walls, August 3, 1946 in Uniontown, PA., "Bud" to all of us who knew him and enjoyed his musical talents, passed away December 26, 2015 in Edgewood KY. We have asked some of his close friends and band mates to share their

memories of *OUR BUD*. Paul Goodridge, Tanner Hill & the River Cats 1995-2015: 'Memories of Bud begin with his quick wit, his laugh, playing with tasteful spontaneity on his instrument and his joy of being in the moment. Playing gigs with Bud came in many varied venues, from sitting under a shade tree, playing for a sack of fresh vegetables to playing for a Military appreciation day at the airport and opening for Sam Bush & Leon Russell.

'Bud enjoyed the adventure and was always on top of his game with everyone he ever played with affecting all who played with him or just listened. He had an encouraging way of making you feel comfortable as a player and as a person. Not only will there be a void left in the bluegrass dobro world but also a void in our hearts and our collective musical souls. We loved you Bud and will miss You and Your incredible talent!' Steve Bonafel: 'I met Bud Walls at the N. KY. 'School of Bluegrass', known as the Hebron Masonic Lodge. I started jamming there in the 1980s and only knew a few chords on the guitar. It started as a form of entertainment for me but I was soon constantly listening to bluegrass music and jammin' with friends. I was invited to join a couple local bluegrass gospel groups as a sideman. Then one fateful night at the Lodge the 'light' went on. For some reason they were short guitar players and

vocalists so I was forced out of my shell. Bud was playing the banjo at the time and was great. I became the lead singer that night singing Jimmy Martin songs and didn't have much self confidence. Bud didn't know me very well but he encouraged me right from the start. You couldn't help but like the guy so when I started my band, 'One Iota', Bud was one of the first people I called and he jumped right in. I knew what he could do on the dobro as well as banjo. When I started writing songs Bud would always listen and say, 'Man that's good', whether it was traditional or out on the edge, always giving me encouragement and confidence. And I was always anxious to see what Bud would add to any new song with his picking and playing styles.

'Many members of the band have come and gone, but Bud was there for the first event in 2001 and our last one September of 2015. Mr. Reliable! As a band leader, I had to mix and match personalities to ensure everyone worked well together but Bud worked well with everyone. I spoke to him the day before he passed away and told him I never heard a bad word said about him, everybody liked making music with him. My kids liked him right from the start because he was short like them (haha).

'He never complained when some of the gigs didn't pay very well. He seemed to love making music every time we took the stage. And he was also creative in the studio. On our first CD recorded in 2001, we doctored up an old hymn for bluegrass and he got the idea to play a line of Dixie on his break. It fit! And got a few good laughs! He also was in on my last CD in 2009 still playing his dobro making good music.

'He was more than a good musician, he was also a loyal friend who had my back when I needed someone to lean on. I think highly of all my musician friends and Bud was a part of my inner circle. He will sadly be missed by all'.


