

24th Sunday Ordinary Year C Luke 15:1-10



"Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them he addressed this parable. "What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it? And when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls together his friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance. "Or what woman having ten coins and losing one would not light a lamp and sweep the house, searching carefully until she finds it? And when she does find it, she calls together her friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found the coin that I lost.' In just the same way, I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

24th Sunday Ordinary Year C Luke 15:1-10

Lost something? Where is it? It is a daily occurrence to hear me, ask myself, "I know I put that book on this shelf? Where did that class outline I printed go? That memo from Owensboro HQ, where is it?" Then I turn over papers, push aside other books, thumb-through letters again, and maybe with Great St Anthony's help, I find it! Celebrate! Yet, in the process I inadvertently hide future 'lost things' in the mad shuffle. But that keeps us humble, right?

Today's long gospel has three episodes of lost things being found! 1) Lost Sheep, 2) Lost Coin & 3) Lost Son. All three 'finds' result in splendid banquets to celebrate the finding/return of what was once lost! Considering the extravagant sound of the feasts and the number of people invited, the banquets probably turned out to cost more than just writing off the lost items! So, I think an underlying point of these parables is that God desires *to make whole again* and *reunite what earlier came apart* (or was separated from us). God wishes to draw back together an original union again. Viewing the three parables as a unit, (of course!), this common theme of 'sets being filled' and 'partials being completed' stands out to me. I notice a series of whole units, 100 sheep, 10 coins and a pair (2) of sons. Wouldn't such conveniently numbered groupings being broken up, be a reason to justify the frantic searching? We have no peace until the entire set is completed again, the last piece is set back right in place. Then the whole gang is back together! Have you ever gone crazy obsessing over one lost piece of a puzzle (of course, it is the last one to fill in the whole picture scene!) Or when one baseball player card of the winning World Series Team gets torn, stolen or destroyed- then the rest of the set is worth nothing compared to the whole team together. Doesn't that 'missing one' bother us to no end? Or how about our frustration when one stubborn musician in our favorite classic rock band, won't cooperate with the rest of the band, getting together for a reunion tour? Such incomplete sets cause an aching, longing obsession in us to get them back together again!

So it is with Jesus! At the Last Supper He prayed to the Father about His disciples remaining whole, when He said, "Father, keep them in your namethat they may be one just as we are one" (John 17:11). And just before He ascended in glory, He "enjoined them [the disciples] not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait [together] for "the promise of the Father" (Acts 1:4). Jesus is calling them to remain whole, to keep together. Of course, His Holy Spirit that arrives at Pentecost, becomes the glue to hold them to one another.

'Seek and you will find' (Matthew 7:7). I commend the searchers in Jesus' parables. They juts don't give up! I am inspired by their motivation to keep hope for the 'lost things' I still keep an eye open for even after thirty years! Because priests seem to be moved so often, I can still count the things that have somehow not made different moves with me, when I was relocated. I feel so strongly that I did pack them, but somehow, they were never unpacked at the new place. I am still missing a favorite coffee mug from a Bowling Green move, and an old framed rock concert bandana (It is probably a priceless collector's item now-of course the band broke up!) And a tape set of Thomas Merton's own voice, of him giving spiritual conferences to novice monks. I can buy replacements, but it just isn't the same as the originals. Right? The feeling of the original returned and made whole again is what creates the unrest to continue watching for and working for its finding again! And just think, that if we feel that way about material things lost, how much more should we feel about reconciling human relations, and bringing people back together. I find this point in Jesus' set of 'Lost Parables'. He is building up the suspense of how we break our necks to find our keys, our glasses, our phones or other, material stuff, so then how much more should we push to work and find 'lost persons'? If I spend a lot of energy to find my lost book, then shouldn't I be spending so much more time and energy restoring a 'lost' relationship or seeking out a person that has become separated and apart from me? May we have that same heart of the 'seeking' shepherd, woman and father in these parables, who desired above all to find and reunite with the lost! Peace, Fr Brian
