We are past the halfway point in the school year already, and winter is upon us. Please be careful to watch the buses and walkers to and from school. We will get snow sooner or later (it's fine if we don't), so please slow down and be safe on all of our roads. Remember to keep the streets clear during snow events so our plow trucks can move safely throughout the city. As of the date I am writing this, we have only had to plow one time and salt several times. Remember, we only salt the main roads and intersections. We also use a pretreatment product that prevents ice from sticking to the roads and allows the applied salt to work at lower temperatures.

The city went out for bid for trash pickup last year and awarded Kimble a five-year contract that starts February 1, 2020. Three companies bid on the contract, and Kimble was the lowest price by over \$2 a month less than the next lowest bid. The only change in service will be that yard waste will now be picked up Continued on page 7



Hello Everyone,

I have received several calls regarding the Kimble bill. Our contracts are for 5 years (Feb to Jan) and include yearly increases. In 2018 the city sent out a public notice for contract bids because the contract was scheduled to end Jan 31, 2019. That contract had a 1 year pick up option (extending the service for another year) for Feb 1, 2019-Jan 31, 2020, which the city agreed to, since Kimble was the only company that responded with a bid. Kimble realized part way through the option year that they had failed to include the .22 per month increases. On the October bill they added \$1.98 for the months of Feb.-Oct. labeled Contract Price Adjust Feb 2019- Oct 2019 and .66 increase (.22 x 3=.66) was added into quarterly billing for 11/1/19-1/31/2020 on the same invoice. The invoices for Feb 2019-Jan 2020 should have been \$15.24 per month / \$45.72 quarterly.

During 2019 the city advertised again for contract bids and three companies submitted bids (Rumpke, Browning-Ferris Industries and Kimble) and Kimble had the lowest bid. When companies are submitting bids for 5 years, they have to consider expenses increasing to maintain trucks, fuel, employees, dump charges, recycling charges, etc. The new 5 year contract with Kimble starts Feb 1, 2020 with a monthly charge of \$17.06 (\$51.18 quarterly). That is an increase of \$1.82 per month from the previous year monthly fee. The price includes weekly trash pick up (small or large tote), weekly yard waste pick up which is now extended through end of Dec (April 1, 2020 through Dec 31, 2020) and every other week recycling pick up. If you do not need either size tote, then Kimble provides a bag option program for residents with very minimal garbage. Call Kimble for details.

Residents weekly trash volume is limited to the contents of the Kimble refuse cart, plus up to 5 additional 30 gallon bags or personal cans weighing less than 50 pounds each and 2 bulk items. Bundled yard waste and trash items must be 48 inches or less, and weigh less than 50 pounds.

Trash is to be placed on the curb after 4pm the day before or make sure it is out before 6 am the day of, incase the Kimble driver picks up earlier then they normally do. If your trash or recycling is not picked up, please call Kimble to let them know so it can be picked up the next day. All bulk items, mattresses, carpeting and fabric furniture must be completely wrapped/sealed in plastic that can be purchased at Ace Hardware, Lowes or Home Depot.

Divorce 101: How to Make Getting a

Divorce Fast, Easy and Cost Effective

article simplistically This identifies the main issues in the termination of the marital contract and explains the difference between a divorce and dissolution and why a dissolution is always the best, least stressful and most costeffective means to terminate the marital contract. The issues in either a dissolution or divorce are the same. They are as follows: (1.) Allocation of Parental Rights and Responsibilities, if there are children. The main issues regarding the allocation of parental rights and responsibilities would include who pays child support and how much, companionship time (formerly "visitation"), who has custody or how is shared parenting (formerly "joint custody") to be allocated, who is responsible for health care/ insurance and how will the tax exemption be divided. (2.) Spousal support. Will one party pay the other spousal support and how much and for how long? (3.) Property distribution. How will the marital real and personal property and all other marital assets be divided. (4.) Pension and retirement division, if in existence. And, finally, (5.) Allocation of marital debt. These are the main issues in every divorce and/or dissolution.

The most fundamental difference between a contested divorce and a dissolution is that in a contested divorce the parties cannot agree on one or more of the issues whereas in a dissolution the parties must agree on ALL issues. Dissolutions are very cost effective. The cost of the dissolution varies based upon the number of issues in the case (listed above). The cost of a dissolution is dramatically less than a divorce (the parties cannot agree on one or more of the issues). The average cost of a divorce with children in Ohio is \$18,800 and without children \$12,500 (Lawyers.com survey). The average cost of a dissolution with children is \$3500 and without children \$2500. Most importantly, the emotional cost of a prolonged divorce is high to both parties and children.

Dissolutions are fast. A dissolution can be finalized in as little as six-weeks from the filing date and, usually, requires only one hearing. An action for divorce- if the parties cannot come to a voluntary agreement- can easily take a year or longer to finalize. There are several hearings and a trial. The information gathering process referred to as "discovery" can become a costly and stressful nightmare. Discovery is not required in a dissolution. In divorce, there is the dread of runaway attorney fees averaging \$250- \$300 per hour. There

is always the worry (which is justified) that the attorney will quit if you run out of money or the fear of receiving another several thousand-dollar bill unexpectedly. Almost everyone has heard a horror story about attorney fees.

are resolved. In most cases, you will not get a better result by engaging in prolonged divorce litigation.

If the parties are unable to come to an agreement regarding all the issues, as is often the case, a divorce must be initiated. I try to resolve as many issues as possible before hand and communicate with the other party or his/her attorney to coordinate the process. It is always best to work together and focus upon resolution of the issues on which the parties agree. The purpose of the attorney is to make the process as minimally painful, and least expensive as possible. Open and honest communication is key. Unfortunately, in many cases, the parties have so much resentment toward each other that they are simply unable to cooperate. This is never in anybody's best interest and can be very damaging to children.

There are certainly ways to minimize the pain and cost of a divorce, but it will never be as efficient and emotionally healthy as two parties coming to a voluntary agreement with dissolution. I believe that a fast, relatively inexpensive dissolution of marriage with minimal stress and pain to the parties and their children is possible in most cases if two factors are present (1.) the parties are mature, sensitive and intelligent and (2.) the matter is approached with a cost versus benefit business analysis, an open mind and sound professional guidance. I know this is easier said than done. But- if accomplished- the financial and emotional rewards (including healing time) reaped are enormous for the parties and children and will be enjoyed for the span of one's entire life.
