We are a family that has adopted 4 children from the Department Children and Family in the state of Florida in 2003. The children have done soap box derby races since 2004, doing some 450 events through the states, from Michigan to Florida. Gerard the middle son, finished third in the World in the All-American Soap Box Derby Championship in 2010 in the Masters Division. Gerard has also finish fourth at the NDR nationals the same year. Sirge, the youngest had a great year in 2012 by finishing as the National All-American Soap Box Derby Champion in the Super Stock Division. The other two children have won regional championships with Gerard and Sirge over the years. After 12 years of racing the children have aged out.

Out of the rat race of racing soap box derby and having the knowledge we do in the sport, we got together and formed CM Box Car Racing in 2014. Then in 2016 we started Sunshine State Superkids. All this to stay involved with the sport we love and to give other children a chance to do what we loved for all these years.

The Capital Campaign:

The estimated amount to be raised is \$400,000. This includes the purchase of property, building, foundation, permits and all utilities needed.

Need for Expansion

- At the present time we are using a piece of property That was donated to use without knowing how long we can stay there.
- We are working out of a pole barn which was enclosed without lighting and air conditioning.
- We have no kind of security available to protect our equipment and tools.
- We have no water or bathroom available.
- A larger facility will give us the available space to enlarge our number of cars.

Impact of the Building Campaign

1. Allow us to acquire more cars which will enable us to have more races and more children enjoying a free day out.
2. Buying property gives us the security of knowing we will have a place to store and work on our cars and equipment.
3. Buying a building gives us the space to work on and prepare our equipment.
4. Within the building we will have windows for air and a rest room.
5. These are conveniences that will enable us to better give the special needs and underprivileged children the safety and security in the cars during the racing days.
6. This will allow us to be able to work the students of Hillsborough County Schools that Sunshine State Superkids is now a partner with.

Why We Do What We Do:

Sunshine State Superkids was developed out of a passion for soap box derby racing and children. We looked at what we can do for the children in Central Florida. We saw children that were not able to do much because of a disability, we looked at what the parents of these children had in Medical Bills. The program then turned to looking at the children living in low income areas or in Homeless Shelters and added them to the program. After all of that we had to look at the children that were disrupted from their homes and now live in the Foster Group Homes, then added them to our program. As we have been looking at all this, we have been surprised with the number of children that are out there with in all these categories.

We wanted to put a program together for all these children and their families. These families just do not have the funds to get involved with any type of programs because of the financial costs. Sunshine State Superkids was developed for all children to just come out and have fun for FREE. Our program also gave the Special Needs Children and siblings the opportunity to be involved together. With the concept of two seat soap box derby cars, both children can do something together bringing family together.

Program Impact:

Sunshine State Superkids hopes to impact all children who have nothing by putting together a fun day of free racing. This includes special needs children of all kinds, foster children living in homes without family, Homeless children, and school children from low income families. We wish to show these children that there is something out there where they can have fun.

The impact of children out there is very large. With our research of the group of children throughout the counties that Sunshine State Superkids is mind blowing. (Children in Foster Care are 8,791, Homeless children are 31,626 and children with disabilities are 39,583). These numbers are disturbing and why we work hard to give the children what we feel they deserve.
