RELEASE OF "A HEAVENLY TWILIGHT" Testimonies Proclaimed by the Holy Spirit Through Ursula Meyer, 1715-1719

Ursula Meyer, born in Switzerland, helped to establish and build the Community of True Inspiration through her work and her testimony inspired by the Holy Spirit.

Now, for the first time, the Amana Church, Community of True Inspiration, has published in book form an English language collection of testimonies proclaimed by the Holy Spirit through Ursula Meyer.

This winter the Amana Church's translation – publication committee assembled and edited this collection of 86 testimonies with contextual annotation and a brief account of Meyer's life and the challenges she faced as a Werkzeug (inspired instrument). The central message of these testimonies, the salvation of our souls through Jesus Christ, is timeless, as valid and important today as it was three centuries ago. The message resonates today; and her life, offers us examples of courage, faith and steadfast devotion to the Lord in the face of persecution and self doubt.


Summer Music Classes for Beginners

SPRING VOLKSMARCH, MAY 15, 2021

The second Amana Spring Volksmarch will be Saturday, May 15, 2021. Volksmarches (people's march) are popular throughout Germany and were started in the 1960's as a way to encourage the population to get out, take a walk, and see the country while enjoying some fresh air and exercise.

The route will be the Amana Colonies Kolonieweg Trail, a paved recreational trail that stretches from the village of Amana, circles the Lily Lake, and runs to Middle Amana before returning to Amana. The complete route is slightly over 4 miles. The suggested starting point will be near the Amana Woolen Mill and Millstream Brewing. Maps of the route are available at the Amana Visitor Center.

AMANA FIRST RESPONDERS NEED VOLUNTEERS

Attention Amana Residents. Amana First Responders are down to one active EMS provider and are actively recruiting for EMT candidates.

When you need Emergency Medical Services and call 911, Amana First Responders are paged to provide basic medical care in all the Amana Colonies until an ambulance can arrive from Marengo or Williamsburg. Over the past year Amana First Responders have only been able to respond to 6 calls of 104 requests.

Amana First Responders are a critical component of our EMS System as it takes an average of 12 minutes for an ambulance to arrive whereas local First Responders can arrive in 5-6 minutes. If you are interested in taking an EMT class and volunteering as a First Responder, please contact Lucas Miller, Amana First Responder Director, at 319-551-5587, or the Iowa County EMS Office at 319-741-6105 ext. 10.

If you are not interested in volunteering, but would like to help, Amana First Responders are accepting donations to help with the cost of EMT training. The current cost for training an EMT is over \$2100.00.

EMT class is scheduled to start August 24th at the Williamsburg Kirkwood Center on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6pm to 10pm. Students must be 17 years old to enroll. Registration information will be published soon.

HISTORIC PRESERVATION GRANTS

July 1, 2021 is the deadline for the next round of applications for the Amana Colonies Land Use District's Historic Preservation Grant program. This intent of this program is to encourage the ongoing and appropriate restoration of historic properties within the Land Use District by providing financial incentives for the improvement of appearance and structural conditions of all types.

The maximum grant amount available to any one property owner is \$2,500 per grant cycle. Properties in the HP-R, HP-C, and HP-I zoning sub-districts are eligible for grants. Priority will be given to residential properties.

This is a competitive grant program. Project applications should include estimated cost of the project, design plans and construction schedules. Work must conform to ACLUD Historic Architectural Guidelines and the Amana Colonies Design Guidelines (both available from ACLUD). Applicants must demonstrate that the work is done to proper standards and techniques to receive reimbursement.

Project examples: Structural: foundation repair; chimney, repair or replacement of existing chimney; tuckpointing; wood siding. Restoration: Wood window sashes, windows and doors, new door hood, return gables, gutters and downspouts. Aesthetic: fences, lighting, trellises.
