Project Description:

To enhance the friendship between the US and China, the Chinese Government (CG) offered to construct The China Garden (TCG) at the US National Arboretum (USNA). The Classical Chinese Garden is an original design developed by a joint team of designers from the Peoples Republic of China and the United States. This 12-acre garden brings a unique cultural experience to the USNA that will provide an in-depth exploration of the elements that create a Chinese garden.

The three TCG areas include 26,000 square feet in twenty-six structures. Three of the twenty-six structures will be support structures that include two public lavatory buildings and a support services building. The remaining structures are garden structures of which eight are enclosed and the rest are pavilions or covered walkways.

Standing Stone Consulting Inc was responsible for the security, anti-terrorism and emergency response aspects of The China Garden design during the preliminary and conceptual design phases. Our team performed a threat, vulnerability and risk assessment and made recommendations for security and emergency response at the Garden.
