

How To Use Your New Cart Guidelines 2012

HOW TO USE YOUR WASTE CART:

Only acceptable household waste placed in your new cart will be collected.
(Extra bags and cans left at the curb or road edge will not be picked up)

Place your waste cart at your designated collection point
by 8:00am on your collection day.

PARK IT

The cart shall be placed on the street with the wheels in line with the curb or road edge. The cart shall not be placed on the sidewalk.

****If there are snow banks along the curb or road edge, the cart may be placed out from the curb or road edge a little further. The cart shall not be placed on the snow bank****

POINT IT

The cart arrows must point to the center of the street.

SPACE IT

The cart should be placed no closer than 1.2 metres or 4 feet from any obstacle or parked car.

General Guidelines:

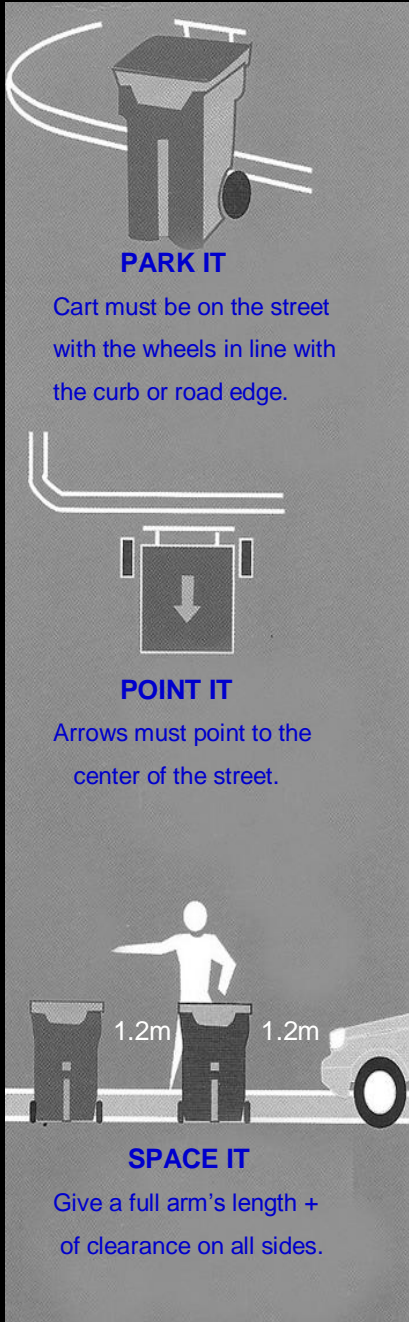
- ✓ Do Not overfill your cart.
- ✓ The lid must be closed for pick-up.
- ✓ Do Not place loose waste in cart.
- ✓ All waste must be bagged and tied. (to prevent blowing litter when carts are emptied)
- ✓ Do Not place Recyclable materials in cart.
- ✓ Do Not place Prohibitive materials in cart.
- ✓ Remove cart from street after collection.
- ✓ Regularly wash your cart.
- ✓ Place cart out for collection by 8:00am on your collection day.

MISSING OR DAMAGED CART:

You are responsible for your cart. If your cart goes missing or is damaged please report it to Athabasca Regional Waste Management Services Commission office right away. Arrangements will be made for a replacement cart at your cost.

Residential Household Waste Guidelines

Acceptable Household Waste Materials:

Includes all normal refuse and garbage which is the result from the operation of a household and shall not include recyclable materials, prohibitive materials or yard waste.

Recyclable Materials Not Accepted in Household Waste:

Empty and clean: Tin Cans; Clear Glass Bottles or Jars; Plastic Tubs and Pails; Clear Pre-Formed Plastics; Plastic Bottles; Plastic Shopping Bags, bread bags, plastic package wraps, case lot plastic wrap and bubble wrap; Flattened Cardboard and Boxboard; Newspaper including magazines, phone books, can labels, soft cover books, sugar bags, glossy brochures and flyers; Office Paper including white and color ledger, NCR paper, envelopes, file folders, printer and copier paper, shredded paper and gift bags; Rechargeable Ni-Cd batteries; Inkjet cartridges; and Refundable beverage containers.

Prohibitive Materials Not Accepted in Household Waste:

Industrial, commercial and institutional waste; **Construction**, renovation and demolition materials; **Combustible**, explosive, or toxic materials; **Household** hazardous waste such as solvents, paints, wet cell batteries, pesticides or herbicides; **Hypodermic** needles or sharps (unless packaged in a sealed secure container); **Pathogenic** or biomedical waste; **Fluorescent** light tubes or bulbs; **Compressed** gas or propane or butane cylinders; **Large or bulky items** such as mattresses, box springs, furniture or major appliances; **Electronics** equipment including TV's, computers, monitors, printers, keyboards and wires; **Automotive** parts including lead acid batteries, scrap metal, oil filters, empty oil containers, tires and parts; **Sawdust** (unless double bagged); **Hot ashes** or other burning matter; **Liquid Waste** or sludge; **Trees**, shrubs, branches over 0.5 metre in length and 1cm in diameter, soil, sod, rock, concrete, stumps or any other woody materials; **Animal waste** including dead animals, carcasses, offal, manure, kennel waste, animal parts or excreta (unless the animal excreta is placed in a double bag and securely tied before placing in a waste cart)

Recyclable Materials Accepted at Any Transfer Site:

Pesticide containers; Used Oil containers, Oil filters and Used Oil; Scrap Metals; Lead Acid Batteries; Tires; TV's, Computers, Printers, Keyboards and Monitors; Paints; Fluorescent Light Tubes and Bulbs and Glass (for detailed list of the above recyclable materials please see the "Transfer Site Recycling Guidelines")

Other Materials Accepted at a Transfer Site or Landfill:

Household Waste, Construction, Renovation and Demolition Waste; Wood, Furniture, Appliances, Mattresses and Box springs; Auto Parts; Trees, Brush, Rock and Concrete.

Other General Usage Guidelines:

No person shall allow solid waste to spill over or accumulate on any lane, street or adjoining public or private property. Every person will ensure that all solid waste is kept within their waste containers.

No person shall set their waste containers at the collection point prior 7:00pm on the night before the collection day. Any waste container located on any street in the Town other than on the designated collection day may be removed by the Town and may need to be reclaimed.

No person shall allow their waste carts to fall into disrepair or become noxious, offensive or dangerous to public health.

Persons shall be responsible to regularly wash their waste carts with soap and water.

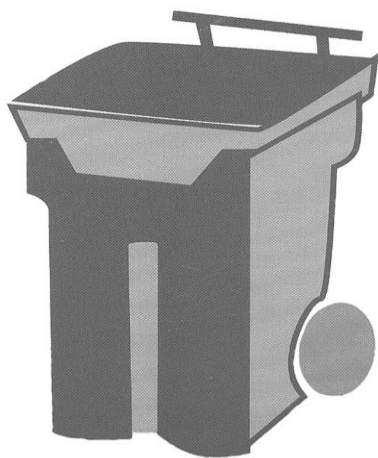
No person shall pick over, interfere with, disturb, remove or scatter any solid waste put out for collection or removal other than the solid waste collector.

No person shall vandalize or wilfully damage any solid waste container.

Every person is responsible for their waste container. If your waste container goes missing or is damaged please report it to the Athabasca Regional Waste Management Services Commission right away. Arrangements will be made for a replacement waste container at your cost.

Non-Compliance with Bylaws

Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of the bylaws shall be liable to penalties as set forth within the bylaw. For a complete copy of your municipalities waste collection bylaw please visit your local office.



PREPARE GARBAGE IN PLASTIC BAGS:

- Garbage must be bagged (and tied) inside waste carts. (No Loose Waste)

YOU MAY PUT OUT FOR COLLECTION:

1 – 64 Gallon (240Litre)
provided for waste cart

YOU MUST:

- Close Lid
- Tie bags within cart
- Place your cart at your designated collection point by 8:00am on collection day
