The Connect2Pearland mobile application for smartphone users is available for Apple iOS and Android devices and provides users the ability to report a variety of issues. The mobile application includes photo sharing and Global Positioning Satellite (GPS) services to attach pictures and coordinates when issues are submitted. Examples of reportable issues include potholes, broken curbs and dead animals.

Connect2Pearland Featured Services

The Connect2Pearland mobile application offers users the following categories of service:

Submit a Report – Offers a listing of a variety of issues that can be reported. Examples include: broken curbs, potholes and dead animals.

My Requests – Allows users to track the progress of their issues until resolved.

Nearby Requests – View other requests in your area.

Settings – Users can enter profile information to allow them to be updated by email when their reported issues are being addressed.



All positions hold equal voting weight at our meetings.

- Master and boards responsibilities HELEN BILYEU
 - Collection of assessments and distribution of each section's portion of the assessments which the Sections and Master set each year. Interest on the section's late payments is given to the appropriate section.
 - Landscape maintenance including but not limited to mowing, edging, blowing, plantings, mulching, pest control, irrigation system, and watering of 18 entrances and 2 parks.
 - All costs associated with the lighting & irrigation for all 18 entrances and 2 parks.
 - Tree trimming.
 - Repair/replacement of all perimeter fences.

- Master and boards responsibilities (continued) HELEN BILYEU
 - Play equipment, sunshades, picnic tables, benches, swings, water fountains & foot washing station, volleyball court, sand box, trash cans and doggy stations in our 2 parks.
 - Upkeep of the lake & fountain with cost sharing with Silverlake.
 - Upkeep of covered structures and the 2 patio structures at our 2 parks.
 - Power washing of entrances, fences, play equipment, patios/pavilions and graffiti removal.
 - Casualty insurance for master and sections at no charge to sections.
 - Directors and officer's liability insurance for the master board.







- State of the Association JOHN FISHER
 - We started the year off with a group of volunteers walking the entrance properties and going over new plantings and plant material removal with a contract landscape company. The landscape company came up with a refreshed design based on the volunteers' suggestion.
 - Southwyck CAI hosted its second all-boards meet and greet with the section board members and management companies in December. Sections 1 and 4 participated.
 - In April several of the Southwyck CAI board met with our electrician to go over adding additional outlets to the park for events.


- State of the Association (continued) JOHN FISHER
 - Early in the year, Lake Pro suggested that we treat the Southwyck Lake Park with Sonar to keep the plant material under control. The algae is controlled as needed by Lake Pro as well.
 - In April we had a topographic survey done of the Southwyck Lake Park so that we can start on a possible clubhouse to replace the covered structure. We are waiting for the updated survey.
 - Quarterly power washing of all play equipment and picnic tables in both of our parks as well as a cleaning of the brick walls along Morgan and Northfork.
 - Continued displaying of Patriotic flags with Boy Scouts Troop 446 maintaining.
 - Website kept up-to-date and relevant.

- State of the Association (continued) JOHN FISHER
 - Fence repairs at Southfield Village began in May. We had 2 fence companies working with us to replace/repair the brick portion and the wooden portion of the fence along Cullen, Magnolia and Morgan.
 - Wooden fence repairs were also done at Emerald Pointe which began in December along Magnolia and Cullen.
 - In October 2022 several of the Southwyck CAI board met with the Silverlake board to go over lake sharing costs with us. We are still negotiating the 2021 lake costs with the Silverlake board.
 - Finalized our 2021 Audit with external auditor.














How you can participate in our association – HELEN BILYEU


- Community Events assist in finding opportunities where we can get our residence and neighboring associations to come together. We are looking for low cost/no cost events and not the Disney World experience.

- 2023 Possible Projects HELEN BILYEU (Order is not order of priority)
 - Continue working on plans to replace the covered patio structure at Southwyck Lake Park and the open structure.
 - Continue revolving power washing program for entrances and brick walls.
 - All section meeting with section boards hopefully twice this year.
 - We will be getting an updated reserve study from an outside firm. A reserve study allows the Board to have a better grasp on how much money we need in our reserve account. We typically conduct a reserve study once every three to five years.
