





fer bible in print. Begin a day with 15 minute reading of the scripture. Read a chapter from Proverbs each day. 31 chapters of Proverbs will suit you with reading each day with each chapter, for example reading chapter 15 on the 15th day of each month.

The best bible translation is NIV: New International Version, 1984. ESV, English Standard Version (2001), has been alternative by many when NIV distorted nearly 4,000 verses with bias on gender issues. NKJV (New King James Version) is a good choice. [LN]




