## 2023 Young Woman **Brianna Johnson**

I was born in Cooma in 1998, I have an older brother who is three years older than me and our parents are Mark and Sharon Johnson. Mum was born in Cooma and her parents are Bruce and Pat Tozer who have lived on the Monaro their whole lives and still to this day live and run a sheep and cattle property named Coonerang which has been in our family for 3 generations. Coonerang is situated halfway between Cooma and Nimmitabel on The Peak Road. The property is roughly 8,000 acres and is home to not only my grandparents Bruce and Pat but also to my great aunt Bev Haylock, Uncle and Aunty, Matt and Jan Hassall and cousins Harley and Cooper. Also, my other aunty Jo Tozer and cousins Charlee and Ian live nearby at The Peak which is ran by Coonerang too.



It was during these family holidays back at Coonerang where my passion for horses began. This resulted in my interest for showjumping which I am still involved in and love. I've competed all over NSW since 2014 where I attended many competitions at a state level with success. In 2000, my dad who spent 10 years on the Monaro in the police force received a promotion to become sergeant on the Central Coast in which myself, my mum and brother moved to the Wyong area on the Central Coast. I went to Kanwal primary school and then a few years later moved to Lakes Grammar an Anglican School in which I started Year 4 there and went on to complete my schooling there in 2016.

My parents bought a 35 acre property in the Lake Macquarie area in 2012 which was nice to have some space again. Throughout my schooling years, every holiday we would all jump in the car and make the 6 hour car trip down to Cooma to spend it out on the family farm helping out with various jobs that needed doing.

After finishing school, I worked at our local post office and then moved onto another retail job within the Hunter Valley while still living at home. In 2018, I decided to attend The University of Newcastle to study a Bachelor of Nursing with the intention to transfer over into Paramedicine, after completing the first year of the degree I decided I needed a change. In December of 2019, I ended up moving back to Cooma where I have lived ever since. I started work at The Alpine Hotel which quickly helped me get to know the locals. I then decided I needed to get a second job so I started work at Hooks Pharmacy and then after almost 2 years there I recently made the change at the beginning of this year to start at Monaro High School as a School Learning Support Officer. After almost 4 years since studying, I have decided to apply to study a course at The University of Canberra in which I hope to study a Bachelor of Medical Imagery beginning in February in 2023.

My family have had a heavy involvement in the Nimmitabel community for many years, where my Nan spent many years dating back to early 2000's on the Nimmitabel show committee helping out with stewarding and anything else that was needed from her. 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg	1/3 cup s

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
250g (8 oz) butter
250g (8 oz) soft brown sugar
½ teaspoon lemon essence OR
finely grated lemon rind
½ teaspoon almond essence
½ teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs
1/3 cup sherry or brandy

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Here is what you do

- 1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least one hour, but preferably overnight.
- 2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
- 3. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support with a wooden spoon.
- 4. Place the mixture into a prepared 20cm (8") square tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 31/2-4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin

This recipe must be used:

Ingredients: Cake

225g butter, at room temp 2 Tbsp milk

225g caster sugar 3 Thsp cocoa powder, sifted

225g SR flour, sifted zest 1 large orange 4 large eggs 1 Tbsp orange juice

- 1. Preheat oven to 180oC traditional oven or 160oC fan forced. Grease and line sides and the base of a 5x9 inch loaf tine with baking paper.
- Beat the butter, sugar, eggs and flour together in a large bowl with an electric mixer until mixture is smooth.
- Split the mixture into two bowls, beat the milk, followed by the sifted cocoa powder into one bowl. Beat the orange juice, zest into the other.
- Spoon alternate dollops of the mixture into the loaf tin, then use a skewer to create a marble pattern by dragging it through the mixture in swirls. Make sure you don't over mix, or you won't see the pattern.
- Bake the loaf for approximately 45-55 mins or until golden and risen.
- When completely cool, ice with chocolate glace icing (on top only).

#### PATCHWORK QUILT GROUP COMPETITION



The exhibit is to be not more than one metre on any one side (rectangle or square shape only) Framed and board mounted exhibits not permitted.

Must be machine pieced and machine guilted.

Minimal Embellishments. Small amount only not to overpower patchwork.

Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.

An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final.

An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level If, for any reason, a winner is unable to compete at Group level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.

All work to have been completed in the last 18 months prior to its entry at a local show. An exhibit that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward In consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select a suitable quilt and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.

Group Final location and date is to be determined by the Group. It is the responsibility of either the exhibitor or the Show Society to ensure the quilt is delivered on Judging Day and collected in an appropriate time frame after the competition.

### WOOL ARTICLE/GARMENT STATE CLASS: 3 DIFFERENT TYPES OF WOOL ARTICLES AND/OR GARMENTS COMPETITION

For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply: Garment: an item that can be worn e.g. dress, jacket, scarf, hat.

Article: a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home e.g. blanket; with an outfit eg. bag; for amusement eg. toy; as a decoration eg. picture etc. Three Different Types: the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or their purpose eg.1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy OR eg.2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy OR eg.3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.

The whole article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of, 80% wool. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of machine is permitted).

- A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice."
- An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
- All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at Group Final.

  The winning exhibit at the Group Final is \_\_\_\_\_\_ then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.


