The Woodward Legacy . . .

In 1827, William Woodward and his wife, Abigail Cutter, donated a parcel of land just south of what is today Cincinnati's School for Creative and Performing Arts to provide money to allow children whose parents were unable to pay to attend high school. Their vision was to offer a primary education to all children of Cincinnati regardless of the family's financial means.

The Woodwards' vision of education predated Ohio's public schools. To further their goals, they established Woodward Free Grammar School and, later, Woodward High School and Woodward College (now part of the University of Cincinnati). While Cincinnati Public Schools (CPS) no longer charge students to attend, Woodward Trust remains exclusively for the educational benefit of Cincinnati students.

The Woodwards' vision & legacy continue today through Woodward High School and Woodward Trust. Over the years, many others have contributed additional money and other assets, each demonstrating their vision and leaving their own unique legacy for Cincinnati students.

Woodward Programs

We currently operate three main programs:

CPS Board of Education Assistance Program

Woodward Trust provides funding to support needy CPS K-12 students. Funds are used for school supplies, book bags, clothing, shoes, gym uniforms, calculators & similar items for specific needy students. Funds also are used for nurse's office supplies, educational field trips and for paying a needy student to perform a small job.

Woodward Field Trip Programs

Woodward Trust provides funding to Cincinnati Museum Center and National Underground Railroad Freedom Center for admission & transportation costs for CPS and Catholic Inner-City schools. Field trips enhance and complement the classroom.

University of Cincinnati Scholarships

Woodward Trust provides 20-30 scholarships of \$1,000 or more to CPS graduates attending University of Cincinnati each year.

The Woodward Trust

The "Board of Trustees of the Woodward High School of the city of Cincinnati" (Woodward Trust) is a non-profit organization which administers donated funds for the benefit of Cincinnati students. It is managed by five volunteer trustees. "Woodward Trust" is actually a combination of several independent trust funds being administered by the same board of trustees.

✦ ***Rebecca Friday Fund*** - At her death in 1940, she bequeathed money to benefit needy CPS 7th and 8th grade students.

✦ ***Louise E. Bettens Fund*** - In 1919, Edward Bettens, a graduate of Woodward HS, created a memorial to his mother of many books, bookcases, pictures, prints and bronzes, plus money to aid needy Woodward HS students.

✦ ***M. Louise Armstrong Fund*** - After her death in 1921, friends & coworkers established a scholarship fund in memory of Miss Armstrong, a teacher for many years at Woodward HS.

✦ ***William Gamble Nast Fund*** - In 1919, an endowment was created by the sons of Francesca Nast-Gamble and William Gamble (the eldest son of the co-founder of Procter & Gamble) to assist in educating worthy and talented Woodward HS pupils for the greatest usefulness to society.
