Jim's Technical Tip by Jim Cannon,


Ignition Cam Screws

I have helped a few Model A owners with an unusual problem: For no reason at all, their distributor goes "out of time". They lose power and have to limp home. They reset the timing and the car runs great again, but after a while the same thing happens and they limp home. Gremlins? No.



The problem is that the ignition cam screw may not hold the cam down tightly to the distributor shaft. After a bit of driving, the cam rotates into a more and more "retarded" position and the engine loses power.

In spite of getting out a big screw driver and tightening the screw as much as possible, the cam still moves on them. Why is this? The SCREW that they are using is too long for the hole that is drilled and tapped in the top of the distributor shaft.





Now the cam will get locked down well before the screw bottoms out in the hole. You also want to inspect the underside of the cam; it should have ridges that help lock it down on the shaft. Once the screw is tight, put the rotor on the cam and gently try to turn it on the distributor shaft. It should not move.

If you or a friend encounters this problem with the engine going out of time, I hope my little Tip does the trick for you.

In Jims's Technical tip featured above he has hit on one of topics that sooner or later a problem develops out of nowhere. What unfortunately occurs is the lack of quality control on the parts that are currently being reproduced for Model A's or perhaps someone has gotten a hold of a bad part that was produced a number of years ago and was also identified as a quality control problem by people in the hobby previously. As a learning experience should you know of a an instance regarding one of these parts maybe at a future clinic we can prepare a list and discuss some of these manufacturing problems. As an example some of the earlier aluminum 2 blade fans made and handled by all of the parts suppliers had an off spec taper where the water pump shaft went in to the fan. It has since been corrected however some of those fans will turn up from time to time from swap meets or in a collection of hoarded parts purchased from a Model A owners estate and cause one of these out of nowhere problems. Lug nuts incorrectly made were another quality problem causing loose wheels which also show up.


